

COMBINED COURT BARON RECORDS FOR LAWKLAND cum FEIZOR

YAS/DD91 1594-1738

These records have been partially transcribed from old photocopies made by Stan Lawrence and from digital images made in 2016-2018 by Mike Slater. They are bound in two tightly bound books so that it is not possible to photograph all words in the centre. (There is a third book for this catalogue number for Austwick). The page numbers are rather confusing with two different sets top and bottom and some pages either missing or mis-numbered.

Book 1 labelled 1594-1688 also contains records for Lawkland cum Feizor for 1689-1714 and is missing records for 1601- 1652 and some other years.

Book 2 is labelled 1688 to 1738 so there is some overlap with Book 1.

Anyone wishing to make a more precise version must check the originals. The records are here put into date order.

Book 1 has been fully transcribed but ideally needs checking. Book 2 has not been transcribed but photographs have been made. Transcription has been carried out mainly by Michael Pearson and Geraldine Reardon, together with Mary Slater, Mike Slater and Jill Sykes over a long period, admittedly with some lack of consistency of style. However the content is sufficiently well-represented to allow preliminary study. Some but not all of the Latin phrases, words and contractions have been rendered into English. A list of such Latin is presented to help the reader. In not all cases have the notes for attendance (c, com, comp), absence (d, df, def) or excuses (ess) been added to the lists of tenants.

Folios 1 to 14 cut out. Folio 8 for 22 September 1585 (listed in Index C) is missing. Folio 15 is November 1594. Folio 180v is the end page.

Folios are also numbered at the bottom in pencil 1 to 172 on recto only (344 sides).
