- (a) Speed limit - in abeyance
- (b) Signpost at junction of B6479 Douk Ghyll road - subject of recent correspondence but still outstanding.
- (c) Road improvement - Studfold to Horton - work in progress.

 A programme embracing all three bridges was reported to be in preparation by the National Park Officer and the clerk was asked to get positive details about the progress of the scheme.
- (d) Joint Footpaths Committee: The minutes were read of a meeting held on 7 Oct 75. Matters of immediate local concern were: Path 36 - Mr Dawson's decision to apply for "closure of the original path and for formal dedication of the new approved path in its place"
 Path 31 - Tay Bridge. A decision was taken to write to ~~write to~~ NYCC in support of Horton PC's request for the construction of a replacement bridge.
- (e) Path 19 - Dry Rigg Quarry. A letter from the NPO setting out a proposed minor diversion necessitated by the quarry workings extending in a westerly direction was approved.

- (f) Path 29 - Horton Station to Moughton Lane. A letter from NPO detailing a diversion to secure a more commodious route and secure the more efficient use of land (by-passing Beecroft Hall) was approved subject to the proviso that the original route is officially closed. The clerk was asked to advise the chairman of the Joint Footpaths Committee of this decision.

- (g) Footpath creation west of Pen-y-ghent. A letter from NPO outlining a route for the dedication of a new footpath from the Shooting Box at the end of Horton Scar Lane to the Pennine Way to the north of Sell Gill was considered. The proposed route impinging on land farmed by Mr Peter Wood of Top Farm made it desirable to consult him in regard to the proposal. It was agreed that Councillor Sutcliffe should ascertain if Mr Woods approval had been obtained.

Sundry Outstanding Matters (Repairs & Replacements

- (a) Pinfold - The clerk was asked to press for some definite information for presentation at the next meeting.

- (b) Notice Board - provision of new board in abeyance pending completion of the pinfold project.
- (c) Dub Lane - collapsed retaining wall had been repaired and it was decided to renew efforts to have the offending rock causing damage to tyres removed.
- (d) Alum Pot Lane - It was decided to renew the request for the installation of a bee-hive type waste bin at the end of Alum Pot Lane. The bin provided by NPO had been sited approximately half way along the lane.
- (e) Alum Pot Lane University Rubbish - pending the long awaited meeting between Mr Robinson and Cllr Morphet students using the hut were being allowed to leave waste bags at Pen-y-ghent Cafe.
- (f) Carved Oak Seat - to be donated by Burnley Pothole Club during spring 1976 - there had not been further news.
- (g) Water Supply - outstanding items were still (i) chlorination (ii) size of storage tank (iii) main to Rowe Farm.
- (h) Chapel Lane - hole in road adjacent to Mr J Palmer's house had been repaired and Mrs Millman reported that Mr Palmer had expressed satisfaction.
- (i) Debris on Road - ICI had advised of plans to instal a wheel wash in the near future and the clerk was requested to obtain the services of the road sweeping vehicle on a regular basis in order to maintain the standard recently achieved along Cragg Hill Road.
- (j) Car Park Litter - Request for two bee-hive type litter bins to take the weekend litter had so far been ignored by CDC.

Streetlighting

- (a) Energy Charges - A notice of revised energy charges from NORWEB was indicative of a 3% increase in the cost of dusk to dawn lighting, and for dusk to midnight by 8%.
- (b) Seasonal Switch-off - It was unanimously decided to arrange for the lights to be switched off in continuance of the established routine. The switch-off to be effected on 12 Apr 76 until the beginning of September 1976. The contractor (Mr J F Capstick) and NORWEB to be advised.

Burial Ground - Memorial - J.R.PARKER - a request for a standard type limestone memorial was approved.

Meeting for Council Chairmen - 25 Mar 76 - The chairman expressed regret at being prevented from attending.

Graven District Council - Notes concerning parish meetings - a note on procedure was circulated for information.

District & Parish Council Elections - A letter from CDC announced that elections would take place on 6 May 76. Nomination forms were handed out.

Commons Registration - At the recent hearing when the council was represented by Jordan Charlesworth & Co, it had been found that the case involving Studfold Moss (CL528) had not been worth pursuing. It had also been found that the Sell Gill Allotment was owned by the Dole Charities Foundation. The Parish Council had collected the rent for this allotment for many years.

North Yorkshire Playing Fields Assn - the clerk reported that the AGM was to be held at Ampleforth College at 7 p.m. on 15 Jun 76.

Winter Gritting - B 6479 - Following this matter being raised at the Annual Meeting the clerk was requested to suggest that the route be amended or other action taken to avoid a repeat of the freak icy conditions when all traffic was brought to a standstill in the Studfold and Helwith Bridge sections of the road.

Highways and Road Safety

- (a) Speed Limit - in abeyance.
- (b) Signpost at junction of B6479 Douk Ghyll Road - still swivelling.

- (d) Dub Lane - site meeting - Mr Staveley (Div Engr) to be asked to contact Cllr Hargreaves who would in turn contact Cllr Carr to fix date or proceed to the site.

The clerk was asked to reply stating that the remarks had been noted and it was agreed to let matters lie for the time being. Cllr Hargreaves proposed that the matter be left in abeyance and this was finally accepted.

Footpaths

- (a) Sign-posting and way-marking generally. The recommended list of signs submitted for; the 'Fourth Phase' had not been erected and the inaccurate signs at Newhouses and Town End had not been rectified.
- (b) Path 31 - Crooks Bridge - The NPO advised that a suitable bridge had been located and hopes to get it in position later this year.
- (c) Path 31 - Tay Bridge - The NPO advised that erosion of the banks of the river necessitated a bridge span of 75' and contact had been made with Mr Walter Sutcliffe of Cragg Hill Farm to investigate the possibility of erecting a bridge lower down the river where there is an existing log bridge. This will introduce a small footpath diversion thought to be acceptable to all parties.
- (d) Path 10 - Selside Bridge - A letter from the NPO advised that the site where the replacement bridge is required had been surveyed and involves a span of 50' 6" and new supports will have to be erected. Outside contractors may be able to supply a pre-fabricated bridge. (in connection with the above three bridges the NPO had suggested a site meeting to be held 6 May 76 at 12.30 p.m at Pen-y-ghent Cafe)
- (e) Joint Footpaths Committee - nothing to report.
- (f) Path 29 - Horton Station to Moughton Lane - confirmation of closure of the old route is still awaited.
- (g) Footpath creation west of Pen-y-ghent - Mr Wood had not given approval as it transpired that he had not been consulted in the matter.
