Chapter 1 The documented history of Langcliffe

Introduction

The original written records concerning the village and Manor of Langcliffe in the ancient parish of Giggleswick in Craven (now North Yorkshire but earlier in the West Riding) are the subject of this account. It is not a continuous narrative but a compilation undertaken since 2000 with some explanatory information wherever suitable and extensive Appendices of available information. A commentary derived from published scholarly texts is included to place documentary information in context.

The earliest document is in the Domesday book of 1086. Some of the material concerns the 20thC - the Church, the Institute, the School, the shops and village life. There are many documents about land transactions and many wills but consideration of these does not extend beyond about 1700 because of the multiplication of family names involved after this time and the large volume of material.

The locations of information sources are rather widely dispersed. Copyright restrictions have prevented the inclusion of images of original documents and illustrative material but transcriptions have been made by us and sources of information are given.
