The jurors aforesaid say that William Newhouse, late of Giggleswick, who held freely, of the lord of this manor, diverse lands and tenements in Giggleswick, has, by his deed dated 30 April 39 Eliz, given and granted to a certain James Falthrop, his heirs and assigns for ever, One capital house or messuage, late the house of a tenement called Catteralls held at an ancient rent of 34s, two gardens adjacent to the same house, lately in the tenure of Robert Carre, One other house, one garden and one barn adjacent to the same capital house, then in the tenure of Richard Browne, One parcel of land called Overcroft, one other parcel of land called Nethercroft, then in the tenure of the said William, One other house called *a barkehouse* and one croft adjacent to the same, And one parcel of land called *le brow*, then in the tenure of Roger Falthrop, And common of pasture and turbary for a rent of 3s in and throughout all pasture and commons of Giggleswick (excepting in Farre close and Narre close, and a portion of bracken according to the rent aforesaid, in and throughout all fields and commons of the town aforesaid, with the appurtenances, All of which the same William had of the gift of Christopher Shute, clerk, who bought them from Robert Carre amongst others, who bought them, amongst other things, from John Catterall esquire. And they say that the premises are held of the lord of the manor, as of this manor, for military service, And the same James appeared etc.

William Craven, tenant, has died. Thomas Craven his son is now the tenant.
[Blank] Burton, tenant, has died. John Burton his son is now the tenant.

Hugh Sailbanke, tenant, has died, and his cottage is now in the Lord's hands. Penalties imposed

Adam Browne should remove certain stones which he put in the highway. 6s 8d

The inhabitants of the town should scour their watercourses in various locations. Swawbeck brigg, Newclose nooke, Swawbeck brigge at Croke Endes 6s 8d

Each inhabitant of Giggleswick should find a sufficient equipped man to keep a vigil in the same place in the daytime for so long as it [*not specified what - flooding?*] continues or may happen, by the course in that area, called Neyborhead (inhabitants of The Eaves excepted). 12d

The barn of William Taylor is in decay for want of *one ribb and certain sparres and eylinges* 3s
(*eyling* - perhaps best rendered as 'outshut' : complete OED and Yorkshire Dictionary by George Redmonds (forthcoming in 2018))

The mansion house of Thomas Remyngton is in decay for want of great timbers, that is to say *one crock, one astree, certain ribs, sparres and eylinges* 2s 6d

The barn of John Burton at hunthwaite wants *three paier of crockes, ribbs, sparres & eylinges* 6s

They seek that the lord's woodward deliver the necessary timber.
