Minutes The minutes of the last meeting were read, accepted and signed.

Matters arising: i Refuse. Mrs A. Dunsdale noted that Scale and Deepdale had not been included in refuse collection routes, and more bags had been promised but were not yet being provided.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT Councillor Bradley reported that the 1992-3 Poll tax would not be so high as had been feared. Some reserves were being used. Estate agents were being employed, at present, to value houses for next year's Council tax. Appeals would be considered. Craven District had collected almost as much under poll tax as under rates, and in Craven there was no increase because of non-payers. The Uniform Business Rate is paid to London after collection. On Local Government reorganisation, Councillor Bradley stated that North Yorkshire and Humberside would be among those first considered.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT.

1. Housing. Councillor Bradley reported that some affordable houses were being built in the area. Housing Associations built some and retained control. At least 20% of those on the Hellifield site were to be affordable. Craven District did have some funds available for council house repair. Very few houses were empty in this area. The Government was encouraging Councils to sell houses to Housing Associations, but there would be a big loss if this were done, and many Councillors would oppose it.

Local Government. The options for change would be considered for North Yorkshire during the coming year. Craven District Council was supporting its own continuance as a unitary authority, though it would be a small one.

Council Tax. Properties have now been valued so that they may be allocated to the various bands, relative to each other. The average is band D valued at £50-60,000. The list would be published in the autumn. Appeals will be allowed after payment of the first bill. 25% reduction will be allowed for people who live alone, but there will be no increase where more than two people live in the house.
