I - Interment Fees.

Non-Parishioners: -

In the case of the burial of a person who at the  
time of his or her death was not a Parishioner  
or Inhabitant of the Parish or Township of Horton-  
in-Ribblesdale the foregoing fees, payments or  
sums (other than the fee for right to erect or  
place a headstone or monument) shall be  
increased as follows: -

(a). Where such person was formerly a  
Parishioner or Inhabitant of the said Parish  
or Township but ceased to be such a  
Parishioner or Inhabitant not less than  
12 months and not more than six years  
preceding the date of death, the fees  
shall be doubled.

and (b). Where such person had not been a  
Parishioner or Inhabitant of the said  
Parish or Township for any period  
during the six years immediately preced-  
ing the date of death, the fees shall

be trebled.

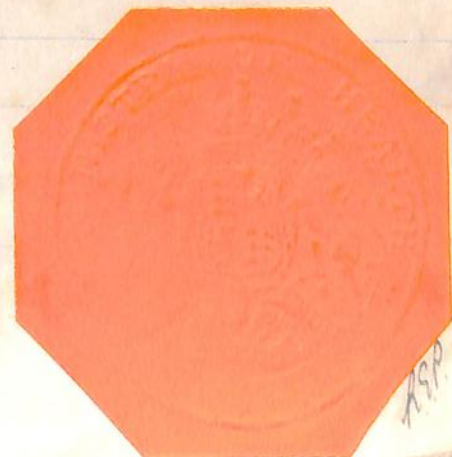

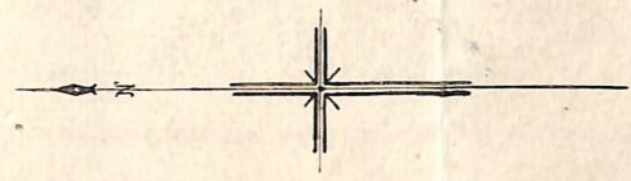

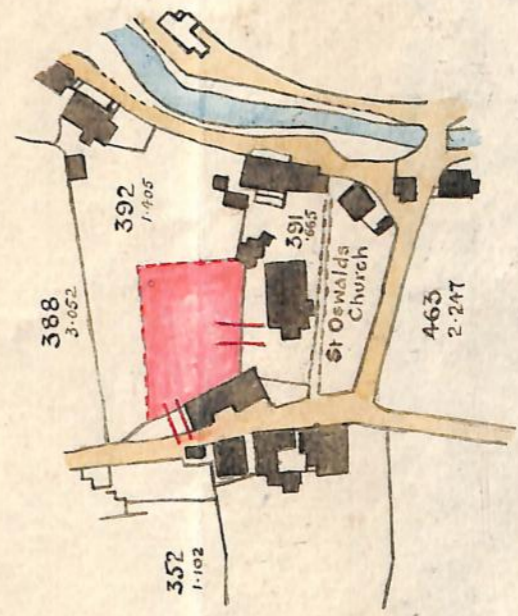

# This Indenture

is made the *thirty first* day of *December* One thousand nine hundred and twenty one B E -

T W E E N WILLIAM FOSTER of Beechwood Iffley in the County of Oxford Gentleman and ETHEL ANN FOSTER of Douk Ghyl Horton in Ribblesdale in the West Riding of the County of York Widow (hereinafter called "the Vendors") of the one part and THE HORTON IN RIBBLESDALE PARISH COUNCIL (hereinafter called "the Council") of the

other part Whereas John Foster late of Douk Ghyl Horton in Ribblesdale : aforesaid at the date of his death hereinafter mentioned was seised of the :- hereditaments hereinafter described and intended to be hereby assured in unencumbered fee simple in possession And whereas the said John Foster :-

previously to his death agreed by a binding Contract in writing to sell the unencumbered fee simple in possession to the Council at the price of SEVENTY THREE POUNDS SIX SHILLINGS but no Conveyance in pursuance of the said Contract was : executed by the said John Foster to the Council And whereas on the

seventeenth day of September One thousand nine hundred and nineteen at a Meeting of the Parochial Electors of the said township of Horton in Ribblesdale duly : convened and held it was resolved that a Burial Ground should be provided under the Burial Acts for the said township And whereas the Council are the authority for the purposes of the said Burial Acts, under the Local Government :

Act 1894 And whereas the Council have agreed with the Owner or Owners of the property situate to the West of the said hereditaments for the purchase of a right of way from the highway to the hereditaments hereinafter described : and intended to be hereby assured And whereas the said John Foster :

died on the Tenth day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty having by his Will dated the sixth day of January One thousand nine hundred and fourteen appointed the Vendors the Executors thereof who duly proved the same on the : Twenty-ninth day of November One thousand nine hundred and twenty in the :-:-

Principal Probate Registry of His Majesty's High Court of Justice And whereas the Vendors have agreed with the Council to complete the said : Contract in the manner hereinafter appearing Now THIS INDENTURE WITNESSETH

that for the effecting of the said Contract of the said John Foster and in :- consideration of the sum of SEVENTY THREE POUNDS SIX SHILLINGS paid by the :- Council to the Vendors (the payment and receipt whereof the Vendors hereby :- acknowledge) the Vendors as Personal Representatives hereby convey Unto the :- Council And that plot or parcel of land situate in Horton in Ribblesdale

aforesaid and containing Two thousand three hundred and forty six square yards or thereabouts and bounded on the North and East sides by other property of the Vendors and on the South side thereof by Saint Oswald's Churchyard and on the West by property belonging to Robert Redmayne and Blackburn Brewery Company ALL which said premises are more particularly delineated and described on the Plan

drawn hereon and coloured Pink To HOLD the same UNTO and TO THE USE of the Council in fee simple AND the Council hereby covenant with the Vendors their

heirs and assigns that they will fence off the property hereby conveyed from the adjoining property of the Vendors with a good and substantial stone fence not less than five feet six inches in height and for ever hereafter maintain the same in good repair AND IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that the transaction : hereby effected does not form part of a larger transaction or of a series of transactions in respect of which the amount or value or the aggregate amount or value of the consideration exceeds Five hundred pounds IN WITNESS whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first hereinbefore written

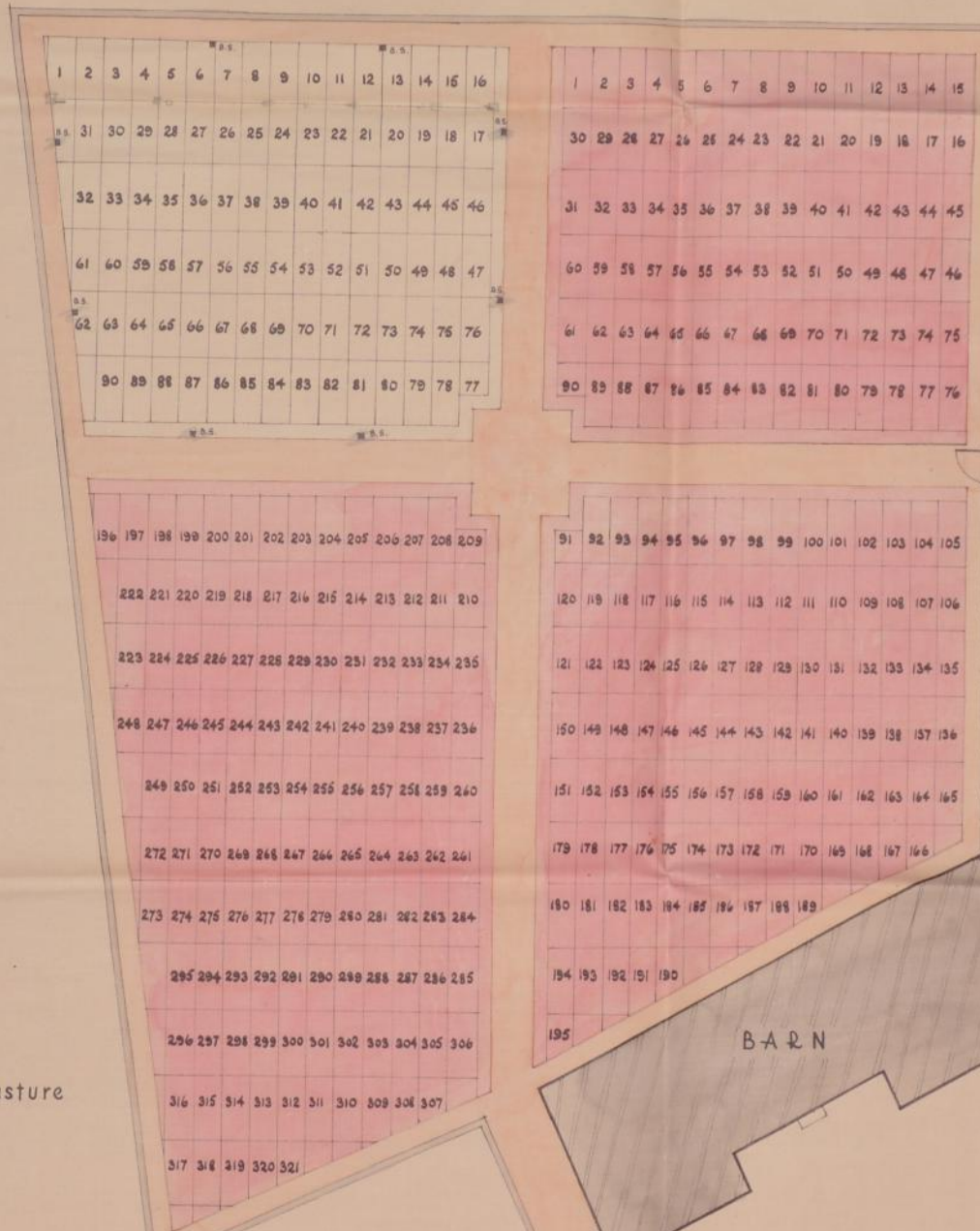

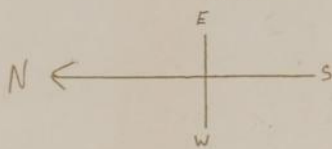
