To be buried in the choir of the parish church of Linton as near the place where my son Thomas was buried as conveniently may be.

To Agnes my wife the messuage and tenement and one oxgang of land which I had by her, which I have late taken and paid for to the right Hon Lord Francis the Earl of Cumberland for 99 years of such three persons as shall be named by me or my executors -- after her death to John Procter my nephew late son of my brother Roger Procter deceased.

My goods after debts and funeral expenses paid into two parts -- half to my wife, half to my son John Procter and my son-in-law John Hargraves equally.

Executors -- my son John Proctor and son-in-law John Hargraves.

Supervisors -- my good friends John Toppan and Richard Burton clerk.

My half part of a messuage called Thwaites to John Procter my natural son and after his death to Richard Procter his son.
