

WILL of William King of Thorpe, Burnsall 1684

Gunsmith.

All my debts and funeral expenses to be paid of my whole estate by my loving wife and I bequeath to her all lands leases goods cattles and chattels towards the educating and bringing up of my children and their maintenance and to dispose of the same as she shall think meet. My loving wife Elizabeth to be executrix.

**Robert King the elder of Thorpe near Burnsall in Craven husbandman died
February the 11th 1668**

To William King my nephew all my late dwelling house, being the house wherein he now dwells, and one foregarth and one girne garth thereto with all barns and buildings; and one cattlegate in the inclosed pasture belonging to Thorpe called Thorpe West pasture for all the term of years yet to come expressed in a lease made between William King his father and myself -- he paying to Thomas King his brother £6 within six months after he shall lawfully demand it and if he is not paid he may enter into the cattlegate until he is paid.

To my nephew Robert King 20 shillings

to Thomas King and Margaret King children of the said Robert two shillings and sixpence each

to Roger Burnbe two shillings and sixpence

to William Burnbie his brother two shillings and sixpence

to John Simms two shillings and sixpence

to Anne Shutt formerly Anne Edeeson 20 shillings

to Robert Edeeson's children 20 shillings equally when of lawful age

to John Edeeson's children 20 shillings equally when of lawful age

to Issabell Shaw wife of Thomas Shaw five shillings

to Thomas Inman and Richard Inman my nephews one shilling each

to Robert King son of Robert King my nephew abovesaid two shillings and sixpence

to William King son of Thomas King abovesaid two shillings and sixpence

all household stuff to Anthony King my nephew -- he executor
