SETTLE TOWN BOOK 1799 & 1800 (Back of it)

At a meeting of the inhabitants of Settle, called by public notice at the widow Wilman's, this 3rd.June 1799.

Hannah Eglin having solicited the payment of half year's rent now due, being one guinea, it is agreed to.

Ino Chester's widow having made the like application, it is thought unecessary.

It is agreed that the allowance made for Ino Harper at Dr. Chew's should be continued as long as there is a necessity for his continuance & the Doctor's care?

It is also agreed that Ann Whitams pension at Kellet? Should be increased, she being very old.

Also Eliz. Whitams 1%? Of such agreeable to their requests.

Widow Geldard of Bell Busk having likewise solicited an increase of pension, the overseer is directed to enquire into her necessities & react accordingly.

Jos. Lockwood of Skipton having some time ago proposed to get his nephew (who belongs to this Town) a place as an apprentice on being allowed 4 guineas & reimbursed some expenses in clothing him, which was agreed to- and the parties now claiming a supply of cloths for him during the whole term, it is resolved that the same should be refused.

It is also agreed that the overseer should proceed to collect as many assessments as will enable him to discharge the large arrears? Due from the Town to sundries, as quickly as possible.

At a meeting of the inhabitants of Settle held at the Folly this 9th.day of Nov.1799 Ino Gawthrop a pauper belonging to this Town having solicited relief – agreed that he shall have a pension of 2/- a week as long as his necessities require it.

Tempest Lockwood having made the like application it is agreed to allow him 2/6 per week as long as he may require it.

Widow Metcalf having applied for relief agreed that the overseer give her a little matter occasionally as he may think proper.

Hannah Elgin having desired a guinea towards her rent agreed.

Jane Huddlestone having stated her inability to maintain herself & 3 small children during the high price of provisions-agreed that she be allowed two guineas for her assistance.

Marg. Chester having applied for her rent-agreed in consideration of the present difficult times that the same be paid.

Robt.Guy & son having applied for an advance of pension which is now 4/-per weekagreed that the overseer make such further allowances to them as may appear to him necessary.

Jos.Dorking? having been? Removed from Muker to this Town under a pretence of his having agreed a settlement by apprenticeship many years ago, but it having appeared on enquiry that he was a farmer in Swaledale subsequent thereto-it is agreed that the overseer look further into the matter & report the result.

Ino Sellars wife having had a paralitic stroke & requiring relief which the overseer has granted- it is agreed that the same be confirmed & he have 4/-per week so long as he require it.

Agnes Taylor having applied for relief from Liverpool-it is determined that the payment of her rent as usual is a sufficient allowance for her.

Catherine Bowskills child being left at Burton under the care of H.Buck who requests 2/per week towards its support, its Mother furnishing the remainder-agreed that the same be allowed.

Robt.Germain having claimed 4/- per week for Ann Germains board at his house 7 weeks grounded? On a promise made to him by the former overseer, Ephraim Hargrave is requested to make the best settlement he can with him for the Town in this business. It being understood that Ino Marsden & his family are now in health, the overseer is directed to take of 6/- per week from his pension towards the house rent.

Ann the widow of the late Thos. Whittam residing at Burton with a pension of 2/6 per week having requested? An increase thereto, it is agreed that it be now 3/4d. p.wk. Thos. Harlings family who we understand to belong to Langcliffe continuing to be bothersome to this Township the overseer is requested to procure an order for their removal to their settlement as soon as convenient.

George Pickersgill being £3:10:6 in arrear towards the support of his bastard child by Jane Sanderson, who is repoprted to be again pregnant to the same person, the overseer is directed to procure a warrant for his commitment after his filiation if he do not pay up these arrears & give proper security to the Town to exonerate them on this occasion.
