westward by Guyholme to Greeta Gill and up said Greeta Gill to  
Sharps House and through part of it and on Best Beck by John  
Howson's of Gill on the East Side of Ravens Close to the River  
Wenning and so up said River to Mill Air and on the south side of the  
Fence in said Mill Air to the River again and up the same to Eska Beck  
and Eska Lane by the backside of Eska House to the Boundary stone  
on Beckwith down Beckwith Sike to the River Wenning so up said  
River to Meer Gill and up same to the Common called Bentham Moor  
to the Graystone on Whitestone Green on the East Side of Threap Haw

to the Road leading between Bentham and Settle and on the same to Sandy Fore by the Double Ditch to Goat Gap and on the East Side thereof up a Rivulet running cross to the Highway to Blindfield Well and so on Blakebank by the Fence on the West Side thereof to the Common and so straight up to a hurdle of Stones on the Gray Scarr and to the Goad Dub and from thence upwards to a hurdle of Stones upon Green Plate so to Guy Sike head and to the hurdle of Stones on Little Ingleburrow and on the East Side of Limestone Side and Cross Ingleburrow down Fair Weather Sike to Meer Gill down same to Bold Haw and up the River Weese to the Chapel and on Weather Coat Clough and by the Gill Head to the Stone in the Mire up a Clough in Ellerbeck Ground and by a Gill to the Top of Whernside then to the Hole in the Fell End so to Brockaslack in a direct Line to the Standing Stone through Green Barn to Ravenwray and then down the River Doe where it runs into and meets Ingleton River where Began

Likewise parcel of Arable and Meadow ground lying on the said Blayke Buts being by estimation one Rood be the same more or less both the said Parcels of ground adjoining to the said Thomas Walker and being in the Townfield of Ingleton as by the said Deed may more at large appear and the yearly rent of five pence.

Item 3 **We** find an Alienation by Surrender from Edward Craven and Ellen his Wife unto Thomas Walker of Moregarth the elder and Leonard Walker his Son of all their right and title to one parcel of Arable and Meadow ground called Fishber head Land Also one Close of Meadow ground called Fishbot Close. Also one parcel of Ground called Moorelands Land. Also one little dale or parcel of Ground being Meadow Ground lying overthwarth the ends of Moorelands lands along by Fishpot Close end and in the Townfield of Ingleton as by the said Surrender doth more or less at large appear and of the yearly rent of nine pence.

- Item 4      **We** find Alienation by Surrender from Edward Craven and Ellen his Wife unto Thomas Walker the younger of Moregarth of all their right and title of one parcel of Arable and Meadow ground called Millalands Land also one parcel of Arable and meadow ground called Fishpot Land also one little Close of Meadow ground called Winewarth close Also five swathes or shafts lying on short Thornber also one Parrock called the over Parrock also one little nook of one Orchard adjoining to the parrock of Thomas Walker the elder all within the Townfield of Ingleton and further we find that it is agreed by and betwixt the said Edward Craven and Thomas Walker the elder and Thomas the younger that the said Thomas Walkers and their heirs and assigns shall have and make their common usual way through the above mentioned little nook of the Orchard up unto Fishber end and so along to Fishber ancient way and the said Thomas Walkers to make all the fence betwixt the moor yet and Fishber end of their own proper cost charges as by the said Surrender doth more at large appear and being of the yearly rent of three pence farthing.
- Item 5      **We** find an Alienation by Surrender by way of exchange from Thomas Walker the elder and Thomas Walker the younger unto Edward Craven of all their right and title of four swathes or shafts lying on Long Thornber also one dale of Meadow ground called the acre end also one little dale of meadow ground lying in a place called Pinderring also four Swathes or Shafts being on the north side of Long Thornber and also we find an Alienation by the said Surrender from Thomas Walker the elder and Thomas Walker the younger unto Edward Craven of all their right and title of that ancient way which leads off the Moor into the Parrock of Thomas Walker the elder and also of that way which leads from their Dwelling house and barn into the lower part of the field and the said Thomas Walker the elder and Thomas Walker younger is to make a way and hinge of Peat at their own Barn end to run off the moor into their own Parrock and not to use any other way henceforth as by the said Surrender doth more at large appear and the yearly rent of one farthing.
- Item 6      **We** find an Alienation by Surrender from John Rowth and Elizabeth his Wife and Alice Seward unto Margaret Knipe of all their right and title of one Fire house and one little garden lying at the Backside of the house and being in Ingleton as by the said Surrender doth more at large appear



and the yearly rent of one penny half penny.

Item 7 **We** find an Alienation by Surrender from William Craven unto Robert Balderston of all his right and title of Two parcels of Arable and Meadow ground lying on a place called Orabada the one adjoining to the ground of Robert Balderston and the other adjoining to the ground of John Cockin both parcels by estimation one Rood be they more or less . Also one hempland adjoining to the ground of Thomas Clarke also one close of meadow ground called the Rishdale and adjoining to the ground of Henry Bouch Esq̄ being by estimation one Rood be the same more or less as by the said Surrender doth more at large appear and the yearly rent of two pence farthing

8 **We** find an Alienation by Deed from Thomas Clarke and Jane Clarke his Mother unto Thomas Redmaine of one Dwelling house one Barn one Outhouse or Stable two gardens one Orchard or grassgarth one parcel of ground whether it be arable or meadow adjoining the said grassgarth or orchard and commonly called the Croft Land and being by estimation Three Roods be the same more or less as by the said Deed doth more at large appear being of the yearly rent of three shillings sixpence.
