Damage to Footbridge

Some time ago a quantity of trees were felled in South Eghal Plantation, Skerton in Ribblesdale on behalf of Mr. Perfect.

As a result a quantity of limbs were left in and on the side of South Eghal Beck. Recently - following heavy rain the stream was in spate and moved a quantity of these limbs down stream towards the footbridge lower down.

Unfortunatly most of these were unable to pass under the bridge, and caused a block across the stream.

In consequence of this the bridge has moved and its foundations are now in a precarious condition.

But for the prompt action of those living near by, who released the block, a more serious position would have arisen, and the bridge might well have been taken away altogether.

To repair the damage thus created will entail a deal of expense and the Council are very perturbed


