Street Lighting

In May 1946 a duly convened Parish Meeting adopted the Lighting Watching Act, when it was proposed to provide a scheme of Street Lighting.

In Sept 1946 a precept was issued for the sum of £50 for this purpose. Owing to various difficulties at that time the scheme was not proceeded with, and the sum of £50 remained in the Lighting Watching Account. As nothing had been in this matter before Aug 1955, the District Auditor instructed that the sum of £50 be applied to the Settlement for the relief of rates, and this was done.

A Parish Meeting has now instructed the Council to have a scheme of lighting prepared for submission to a Parish Meeting together with all particulars of cost etc.

I have now got all the necessary particulars to hand and I have been advised by the Clerk of the Settlement to write you to clarify the points which I state

- 1 As the Lighting & Watching Act was adopted in 1946 does it still stand.
- 2 As we are not asking for a loan are we at liberty to proceed with a scheme without any further permission from anyone - for instance the Traffic Commissioners
- 3 Can we precept for the amount required or are we obliged to keep to the 80 limit
- 4 On a provisional estimate given by the Electricity Authority the scheme is to cost approximately £ 271-6-0.
- 5 The income from a 1d rate is £ 33 per annum.

I should be glad if you could advise me on this matter and give me the correct action to take.

I thank you for your letter of the 13th Feb which I placed before my Council after consideration it was decided to present the original estimate to the Parish meeting which was held on Monday evening.

There were only 43 people attended and there was a very mixed feeling. The people from the Sheffield District did not want street lighting because they would have to help to pay for it, but would not derive any benefit from it. A very poor outlook indeed. There was a lengthy discussion and when it was put to the meeting it was decided by 19 to 20 not to ~~have~~ accept the scheme, so we do still without light.

The Council were very disappointed at the result as they felt that this was a reasonable scheme and not too costly and they felt that the Parish would accept it without much trouble - albeit it was not to be. The most disappointing feature was that the very people who had asked for it would most enjoy lighting were not present to support it. We all have had a lot of work preparing this scheme and are disappointed. I have no doubt that it will all come up again in the near future.
