Conversion of Golden Lion Hotel

It has come to the notice of the Parish Council that the Golden Lion Hotel in Horton is to be sold for use other than as licensed premises. It is to be noted that the sale may have already taken place.

The inhabitants of this village bitterly resent the loss of the local pub & no wonder when one drinks after another is being withdrawn from the parish (Butcher's Co-op Shop Local Order).

Apart from being a pub, the hotel was used for Weddings, Christenings, funerals for meals & other family occasions.

The ratepayers of Horton have urged the P.C. to ask Town Council to oppose any alterations, other than as licensed premises, which may be proposed under the Town & Country Planning Act.

Notice of the Board of Health of the

I have been authorized by the above
 Council to write to you for choice and
 regarding matters that have arisen in
 connection with a business house on
 this village near the New Brewery of
 Blackburn owners of the above Hotel
 are in the process of selling the Hotel and
 body thought to be an education authority
 for purposes other than at licensed premises.

If this is so my Council wish to oppose
 this change of use in every way possible.

It is appreciated that many large
 buildings in the Dale are being bought
 for this purpose - that many of them would
 otherwise be left derelict. It is also
 appreciated that the Owners of one
 Hotel have a legal right to sell for the

best price possible - however due to a
 great difference in the effect on village life
 of the sale of a farmhouse as opposed to the
 sale of the village pub, which is often used
 for the social side of holding Friends
 Class Meetings & similar services.

In the last few days a boy in the
 Village, known for the express purpose has
 purchased the old industrial chapel you
 are in a village hall & the purpose of the purchase
 is the building of the decision to keep -
 was the fact that the building was built
 was only in your way - that the avail-
 ability of food & refreshment would be
 to the benefit of all & local needs.

It is well known locally that the
 serious bids were made by people who had
 by people who had every intention of
 continuing to run it as an hotel & the
 acceptance of our bonds have been in the
 best interests of the local people.

My Council wish to oppose the sale
 of the building for any purpose other than its
 present one by any legal means open to them
 They also wish to oppose any
 & planning application connected with
 the proposed proposal whether it be

for 'change of use' & for structural alteration.

The Council would be pleased to hear if you can give us any advice or help as the local residents are bitterly resentful at the thought of losing yet another amenity to the village.

The last few years have seen the loss of two shops, a building business & a manager's residence & the loss of the local church hall to add to the difficulties of maintaining a proper community for our village.
