Crook's footpath. Mr. R. Harper again raised this question, asking what had been done in the matter. The Chairman replied that he and the Clerk had interviewed John Foster Esq., and he said no public footpath existed, at the place in question, but he subsequently had called upon the Chairman and expressed his willingness to allow the public to use the path across the fields known as Humbers meadows, if the Parish Council could see their way to erect a Bridge over the river Ribble at the bottom of Crook's pasture, but owing to the excessive cost of labour and material at the present the matter was left until some future time.

Redmayne seconded and it was carried unanimously that the Burial Acts be adopted for the Parish.

The Clerk of the P.C. was requested to write to Messrs W. Foster, J. Foster, J. Foster, Jr. & Brabtree to ascertain whether they were prepared to sell, and upon what terms, about an acre of land for burial purposes.

1. To receive a report from the Parish Council as to the steps taken for the provision of urgently needed additional Burial Ground, and
2. To consider whether the Burial Acts should be adopted for the parish

The minutes of the previous meeting having been read these were duly confirmed on the proposal of Mr. Swinbank seconded by Mr. A. Wilcock.

The Chairman - Mr. J. Wiseman - then called upon the clerk Mr. W. E. Pitts, who stated what had been done in the above matter, and explained at some length the sanitary conditions etc relative to the Burial Acts.

- (1) The first resolution "That a Burial Ground under the Burial Acts 1852 & 1885 be provided for the parish of Hoston-in-Ribblesdale" was proposed by John Swinbank & seconded by A. Wilcock when nineteen voted for it, none against it & there were not any neutrals. The proposal thus being received with unanimity.

- (2) A second resolution "That the Parish Council as the Burial Authority are hereby empowered to incur all conse-

quent expenses in purchasing and laying out such burial ground, in erecting any buildings thereon and in the provision of equipment, etc." was moved by William Redmayne & seconded by Rowley Harper. On being put to the meeting seventeen voted for it; against it, none; neutral, none.

- (3) A further resolution "Subject to its suitability this parish meeting urges the parish council to secure as early as possible by agreement or otherwise about an acre of Town End Pasture owned by Mr. John Foster, for a Burial Ground", was moved by John Swinbank, & seconded by William Redmayne

This was carried by eighteen votes one elector remaining neutral, there being nineteen present.
