Hall on Friday evening 9th May 1924
at 7. 30 p.m. the chairman of the Parish
Council presiding over a gathering of
fifteen electors.

The minutes of the preceding meeting
were read & duly confirmed on the motion
of H. Knowles seconded by B. T. Deselline.

The meeting was then called to consider
the revival of the Cricket Club which
has been dormant for some ten years;
when on the proposal of B. T. Deselline
seconded by H. Knowles it was decided to
attempt to revive the club.

Seeing that no other field was available
Mr. B. T. Deselline consented, though some-
what reluctantly, to allow a meadow at
Down End Farm to be utilised as a cricket

ground with the hope that a more suitable accommodation could be secured before another season.

A sub-committee consisting of Messrs J. Stolland, Jon. Morphet, E. Sarquison, C. Read, B.T. Heseltine, Jos. Wiseman was appointed to interview the Committee of the old Cricket Club to ascertain if the latter were willing to hand over any suitable material to the new committee, if such were formed, and to report to an adjourned Parish Mtg. to be held at the Public Hall on Friday the 16th inst. at 7.30 pm.
