C. W. Pallard presided over a moderate attendance, but a better one than has been the case for many years. There being 10 ratepayers present in addition to the council.

Minutes, The minutes of the meeting held on Mar 21st 1960 were read & adopted on the motion of W. Beresford Sec W. Gaudroger.

Dob's Charities, The statement of accounts in connection with the Dob's Charities for the year Dec 1959 was read and duly recorded on the motion of W. Beresford Sec W. Parker.

Financial Statement Parish Council, The financial statement of receipts & payments of the Parish Council for the year ending Mar 31/1960 were presented and were adopted on the motion of W. Coateshott Sec W. Gaudroger.

A lengthy discussion took place on various matters which affected the Parish generally among them were included footpaths & rights of way, and street lighting.

Footpaths, W. Coateshott asked when the survey of footpaths might be expected to be completed & when a plan of street footpaths would be made public, in addition he complained that some footpaths were blocked up.

On the first part of the ^{question} Chairman explained that only last year the council had been notified that the survey of footpaths was not much more than half completed, but that every effort was being made to get the work done, and hoped that it would not be long before plans were available. On the second part of the question the clerk stated that if there were obstructions on any of the right of way it was the duty of anyone finding such obstructions to report them in writing to the council when the appropriate action would be taken.

It was agreed that the council write the wille on this matter. Lighting & Lighting Act. Enquiry was made if ~~any~~ there was any possibility of street lighting being provided for the parish. The Chairman explained that when the matter was first brought up in 1938 it was voted by a large majority. At this time the cost would have been about £26 per annum including cost of providing the street light & maintenance. At a later date when the act was adopted the cost had risen to £46 per annum.

Lighting at the present time had to conform to the Traffic Commission's specifications and it was anticipated that this would be something like £200 to provide plus cost of maintenance. After further discussion it was agreed on the motion of W. Gaudroger & Sec by W. Fowler that at Parish Meeting he called to discuss the matter. In the meantime the council to get all material available to present to the meeting.

Another question was raised relating to Bridge Cross at Settle. It was pointed out that
