Annual Parish mtg. held the 31st Dec. 1927

The chairman of the P.C. presided over a large number of telegrams.

The minutes of the last mtg. were read & duly confirmed.

The a/cs of the eleemosynary charities of the Township were submitted, having been prepared by the Treasurer, Mr. W. B. Burtwick, & forwarded to the chairman according to Statute. Attached hereto are the figures. The total income was £95-12-3 (including a balance of £15-15-3 bro. for^d): £71-0-0 was divided in varying amts. from £10 to £1 amongst ~~23~~ 23 beneficiaries: £7-7-0 to infirmaries & hospital: establishment charges £1-1-0, leaving a credit balance of £16-4-3

Mr. R. Dinsdale requested a statement as to the P.C. a/cs: mtgs held & work done.

These questions were readily answered by the chairman & clerk.

Burial G^o Gates. The Rev. W. A. Rawcliffe raised the matter of locking the gates on instructions from the Diocesan Registrar, when the clerk stated that the latter had no 'locus standi' in the ground, & it was a matter solely in the discretion of the P.C.

Pathway - The Vicar proposed & Greenbank seconded that it be an instruction to the

Ab to apply for a faculty to make a permanent pathway from the churchyard to the Rurist G.O. through the opening of the priest hedge.

Note. It was subsequently ascertained that this was 'ultra vires' so far as the P. C. was concerned.

The Vicar also raised the legality of the removal of the northern boundary wall by the Ab. when a letter dated 26th Apr. 1920 from Mr. Whaley, the then vicar, to the Chairman of the P. C. read as follows —

"Dear Sir,

At a mtg. of the Vestry held on Friday last, 23rd Inst. it was resolved that sanction be given to the P. C. to remove the ^{northern} boundary wall of the churchyard on condition that a priest hedge be planted in its place."

Sewage Scheme. Mr. Rawcliffe raised this affair when the clerk read an extract from a letter as follows

Annual mtg. held on the 12th day of Mar. 1928.

The Chairman of the Parish Council presided over a large gathering of qualified persons and after the reading of the minutes, which were duly passed, the chairman vacated his position in favour of John Swinbank.

The first business was the election of Parish Councillors for the ensuing three years when nomination papers were handed in on behalf of -

After opportunity was given for the electors to question the candidates, the voting by a show of hands resulted as supra; thus Messrs E. Read, J. W. Hall, C. Dowler, W. Wilson, Dinsdale, E. Sarginson & J. Balkels were declared by the chairman to be duly elected.

The a/c of the Dale charities as prescribed by law were submitted by the Treasurer Mr. Butterworth of Kettle to the Chairman as per adhesive statements.

Annual Mtg. held on Mar. 28th 1929.

Mr. Hobalkeld (chairman of the P.C.) pres over a fair gathering, and after the minutes of the preceding assembly had been duly read & confirmed it was announced that the Treasurer of the eleemosynary Cha who was under a statutory obligation to supply a detailed account of such had failed to forward to the chairman, whereupon it was decided to adjourn the mtg. until the a/cs were forthcoming.

Subsequently an animated, and at times acrimonious, discussion took place as to whether the Parish Council were acting "ultra vires" in repairing the roads on the Village Green & the approach thereto.

Confirmed at meeting held July 1929. with rider that the omitted resolution in names of Mr W. Pollard & H. Wilson that proposed purchase of fire fighting equipment be strongly opposed against Clerk write R.D.C. to this effect, he entered.
