The reason for this enquiry was the fact that this strip was being used by the WPA as a dump. The chairman remarked that this matter would be looked into.

Derelict Building at the Crown Hotel. A complaint was made about the untidy way the place has been left in since the demolition of the Old Shop in New Inn Square. It was a very unsightly place.

Public Hall Site. A complaint was made about the unsightly state of the place where the Public Hall had been, and ^{asked} if some thing could not be done to remedy this.

Sewage Pipe across Kibble. Enquiry was made about the sewage pipe which had been across the Kibble, but had now disappeared. It was felt at the meeting that some thing ought to have been done before this, and it was considered a disgrace to the Parish that all this fume sewage was being emptied direct into the river.

Financial Statement. The Financial Statement of receipts and payments for the year 1964-65 were presented and approved on the motion of Mr. W. Pollard, seconded Mr. J. Hopket.

Dole Committee The statement of accounts in connection with the Dole Committee was presented for the year ended December 1965, and was duly recorded on the motion of Mr. W. Pollard, seconded Mr. Richardson.

Bus shelter at Helwith Bridge. The erection of a bus shelter at Helwith Bridge was discussed. This was felt to be a necessity as both adults and children had long walks for transport in all kinds of weather. Mr. Pollard thought it was an excellent idea and said that every effort would be made to obtain one. On the proposal of Mr. Floyd, seconded Mr. Hodgson and agreed, the Clerk was instructed to write to the Settle Rural District Council asking for details.

Footbridge at Foredale. It was reported that the footbridge at Foredale was in a very dangerous condition. As this is a public footpath and therefore not the responsibility of the Parish Council, it was felt that the attention of the West Riding County Council should be drawn to it, especially as it is used by children. It was proposed by Mr. J. H. Hopket, seconded Mr. H. Firth and agreed that mention should be made that the bridge between how Swiswith and Helwith had been washed away. This meant that the recognised

Speed Limit. Several complaints were brought to the notice of the meeting concerning the excessive speed of large lorries passing through the village of Horton. These were becoming an increasing danger especially to the many young children using the road. It was proposed by Mr. Anderson, seconded Mr. J. H. Hopket and agreed that the Clerk write to the Settle Police asking what action, if any, could be taken to keep the lorries within their 40 m.p.h. speed limit, and also to enquire about the possibility of restricting speed to 30 m.p.h. throughout the village.

Horton Quarry Discussion took place regarding the excessive amount of black smoke and soot which was coming from the Quarry at the present time. On the proposal of Mr. J. H. Hopket seconded Mr. Anderson and agreed, the Clerk was instructed to write to the I.C.I. asking if this could not be greatly reduced.

Street light. The erection of a street light at Studfold was discussed. On the proposal of Mr. Firth, seconded Mr. Richardson and agreed, it was decided to look into the matter in the near future.

Questions Mr. J. Wilson reported that he was having difficulty in getting his dustbins emptied. As most of the village is well taken care of in this respect it was felt that the meeting could not support his claim and it was suggested that Mr. Wilson contact the dustmen personally.

Straying sheep. Mr. Johnson reported that he was still having trouble with sheep constantly straying into his garden and causing damage, even after contacting the farmer responsible. Whilst the Parish Council had no legal responsibility it was proposed by Mr. J. H. Hopket seconded Mr. Perfect and agreed that the Clerk write to Mr. Duddiffe stating that numerous other complaints had also been received
