#### CAMP SITE

Mrs L - described the temporary toilet facilities.

RVH - indicated that when amenity block constructed this should cease. Site licence does not coincide with National Park requirements. RVH met Mr John Crawley last Friday to investigate complaint about car park. There was some question as to how site licence operates about parking of cars. Matter to be brought up at National Park planning meeting and there was a question as to whether car parking area as it stands is valid?

Mrs L - coaches block road entering and leaving site.

RVH - gates have to be set back 15 ft.

Mrs L - had personally detected discrepancy between plan and actual car park layout.

RVE - explained that camping will only take place when completed, and design for this will be in hands of development control officer for meeting in June '78.

Mrs T - Emphatically suggested that camp site should be shut down until amenities are installed.

RVH - talk about complexities of the car parking and the problem. It was thought that top soil over the hard core might be acceptable.

#### ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PARISH MEETING HELD IN THE ENDOWED SCHOOL ON MONDAY 10th APRIL 1978 at 7.30p m

1. Minutes of the Assembly held on 26 May 1977 were read and confirmed as a correct record. Proposed: Mrs S M Millman, Seconded: Mrs H Huddleston
2. Financial Statement, Parish Council The Financial Statement of the Parish Council for the year ended 31 March 1977 was circulated and adopted. Proposed: S W Ogden, Seconded: Mrs H Huddleston.
3. Financial Statement, Dole Charities The statement of accounts relating to the Dole Charities for the year ended 31 December 1977 was presented and accepted. Proposed: S W Ogden, Seconded: Mrs H Huddleston
4. Chairman's remarks The Chairman welcomed Mr J E Wilson to the Council and thanked Mr P A Bayes for his service as Clerk and Treasurer. A noteworthy feature of Mr Bayes' contribution was the development of an efficient filing system in a period when there was a large increase in paper work. The Chairman thanked members of the Parish Council for their co-operation and hoped that those who had been unable to share site meetings held during the day would find it convenient to do so in the future.

The additional precept of £300 during the year was necessary because budgeting in the past two years had not taken sufficient account of inflation and the unexpected expense, e.g. repair of Lych gates. It was hoped that the precept of £670 for 1978-79 would be adequate.

The number of parishioners taking advantage of the Public Participation session at Council meetings, instituted in November 1977, had never exceeded two.

5. Rates Mr Ogden queried the large increase in rates, particularly those of the North Yorkshire County Council. The Chairman pointed out that one factor causing the latter was due to the Government shifting support from the Shire counties to Metropolitan counties.
6. Matters of General Public Interest
  - a) TV transmitting station at Brackenbottom Farm Mr Ogden initiated the airing of views about the need for this station. On hearing that the North west end of the parish receives poor signals on ITV programmes, it was felt that the proposed station would supply a felt need.
  - b) Bridge at Southern entrance of village In answer to a question the Chairman replied that he was unaware of any plans of the bridge being prepared.
  - c) Proposed waiting restrictions The Chairman described the origin of, and proposal for, waiting restrictions and reported that there were three objections in response to the public notice of the intention to make an Order. Two of these recognise a need for restrictions but only on weekends and bank holidays. The third objector, Mr Bayes, was against the proposals being of the opinion that they would drive visitors out of Horton. It was felt to be rather late to make this objection since Mr Bayes had known of the proposals for about four months. Mr Bayes made what might prove to be useful proposals, (i) to place an notice in the car park giving alternative parking sites to be used when the park is full, (ii) to take up a previous suggestion of marking the car park with white lines in the hope that this would increase its capacity. The problem will be to find alternative parking sites and to explore the possibility of extending the car park. On the other hand, a view expressed was that increased parking space would never meet the demand.

Minutes of a Special Parish Meeting held on Monday 11 September 1978  
at 7.00 p m in the Endowed School

Present: Two parishioners (Mrs Long, Mr Barker), District Councillor H H Cook and six members of the Parish Council: Mrs S M Millman (Chairman), Miss K M Foster, Mrs H Huddleston, Messrs W J Bentham, R V Hargreaves, J E Wilson.

Parish Boundary Review Following a recent decision of the Craven District Council to undertake a review of the parish pattern in its district, the Parish Council is required to forward its views and those of parishioners to the Clerk of Craven District Council not later than 31 October 1978. The Parish Council resolved that this meeting be called to hear the views of the Parishioners on a resolution that the boundary of the parish should be altered to include Dry Rigg Quarry.

As this meeting was not well attended, the Parish Council was unable to obtain the views of a representative sample of parishioners.

Minutes of a Special Parish Meeting held on Wednesday 1 November 1978  
at 7.30 p m in the Village Hall

Present: Twenty-two parishioners, District Council H H Cook, six members of the Parish Council: Mrs S M Millman (Chairman), Miss K M Foster, Mrs H Huddleston, Messrs W J Bentham, S W Ogden, J E Wilson and by invitation, Mr J R Cockcroft, Chairman of Yorkshire Regional YHA.

Planning Applications YD/5/44/62 Erection of new youth hostel to provide 60 beds, etc. Main Street.

The Parish Council resolved to convene this meeting in order to gain the opinions of parishioners on the application.

Mr Cockcroft gave an account of the function and nature of a Youth Hostel and Miss Foster described the visit made to Hawes Youth Hostel by the Chairman, Mrs Huddleston and herself on behalf of the Council. The visitors were impressed by the high standard of all aspects of the Hawes Hostel. Mr Cockcroft said that a Youth Hostel in Horton would provide a necessary link on the Pennine Way between Malham and Hawes. The nearby Stainforth Hostel did not cater for Pennine Way Walkers in the same way as it now specialised in school parties. He gave assurances of high standards in building and facilities and also of behaviour by members but he could give no assurance that the proposed hostel would exclude parties of school children.

Of ten parishioners who contributed to the discussion, most expressed doubts and concern about the application, especially as press reports had misled people into thinking that a youth hostel in Horton was a certainty before councillors had had an opportunity of considering the application. There was concern about the adequacy of the water supply, a further influx of under-disciplined school children, Horton ratepayers and tax payers would be helping to subsidise the proposed hostel for 80 per cent of its cost, the hostel would be of no appreciable value to village life, a large building would dominate the centre of the village and this would act against the interests of local people, local residents who had invested in residential accommodation would probably be adversely affected - to name the main reservations. Mr Waterson, himself a member of the National Park Committee, pointed out that what was good for visitors to Horton was not always good for the village. Horton was a leisure area and the Committee were promoting the image, but were also committed to preserving the village community. These two aims did not always coincide. Councillor Cook pointed out that it would be a definite priority that parking space should be provided if a hostel was built.

The Chairman closed the meeting at 9 p m when no further comments and questions were forthcoming and thanked everyone who had participated.

1. Minutes of the Assembly held on 10 April 1978, a Special Parish Meeting held on 11 September 1978 and a Special Parish Meeting held on 1 November 1978 were read and confirmed as correct records. Proposed Mrs Crossland, Mr Hargreaves, Miss Foster, Seconded Mrs Huddleston, Miss Foster, Mrs Huddleston, respectively.

2. Matters arising Car Parking County Councillor Hargreaves said that the National Parks Committee has been looking at the problems, e.g. should Car Parks be provided by the Parks Committee or the District Council? should a parking charge be tried by the Parish? would marking the village car park with white lines increase its capacity? The Parks Committee continues to study these problems.

3. Financial statement, Parish Council The financial statement of the Parish Council for the year ended 31 March 1978 was circulated and adopted. Proposed: R V Hargreaves, Seconded: Miss Foster.

4. Financial Statement, Dole Charities The statement of accounts relating to the Dole Charities for the year ended 31 December 1978 was presented, circulated and accepted. Proposed: Mr Bentham, Seconded: Mrs Huddleston.

5. Financial statement, Village Hall The statement of accounts relating to the Village Hall for the year ended 28 February 1979 was presented, circulated and accepted. Proposed: Mr Barker, Seconded: Mr Towler.

6. Chairman's remarks After giving a welcome to those in attendance thanking District Councillor H H Cook for his regular attendance at Council and Parish Meetings and giving the Parish Council invaluable help and thanking members and the Clerk of the Parish Council for their co-operation, she summarised the main business of the Parish Council during the previous year.

Public participation While only a small number of parishioners have attended ordinary council meetings, there were between twenty and thirty at two special meetings called to consider planning applications to erect a Youth Hostel in Main Street. The majority of those attending supported the council in rejecting the applications, but at the same time regretted that this would deny Mr K Middleton the opportunity of a sale of property.

Waiting restrictions These have improved parking somewhat, but we are still far from coping with the increasing number of cars. The restrictions are to continue with a small amendment which will allow parking outside Pen-y-Ghent Stores. Parking still occurs on the frontage of land at the vicarage and between the entrance to the Pennine Way and the Post Office Stores. The Council is hoping to prevent parking on these areas by planting shrubs and trees on the boundary.

Tree treatment and planting The Council is grateful to the National Park Committee for a donation of £194 to make the Horse chestnut near the footbridge on the Beck side safe and to plant four young trees on the Beck side.

Foxwood School In response to a complaint made to the headmaster about rowdyism and inconsiderate behaviour at the Outdoor Pursuits Centre (Golden Lion), the head will investigate any complaint provided he is given the details promptly.

School Transport The Council has exchanged correspondence with the County Education Officer about the institution of charges for pupils living less than two miles from the village school. The Officer said that his committee, while reviewing regularly the charges of concessionary fares for primary pupils, did not feel able to change their policy.

Adult Education The revised constitution of the Settle Advicosy Committee for Adult Education requires a parish representative to be a registered student of Craven College. Following Council's complaint that this resulted in the parish not being represented on the Committee and since Horton has not had an adult class for two years, the Committee has invited a representative to attend a Committee meeting in May 1979 when the classes for 1979-80 will be arranged. The Clerk is displaying notices about the classes on offer.

Settle Area Swimming Pool For the past three years Council regretted that it has not had enough money to be in a position to contribute to the running of Settle Area Swimming Pool. Council believes the Pool is a great benefit to the area, in particular it gives children to the village an opportunity to learn to swim and enjoy swimminf. She hoped and believed that parishioners would be in favour of a small levy on the rates in the coming year for a donation to the Pool.

7. Matters of general public interest

Environmental pollution and energy conservation Mrs Crossland raised the matter of the local quarry continuing to emit black smoke. This not only pollutes the area, but it is a waste of fuel oil, this at a time when we are encouraged to conserve fuel and when householders can not get delivery of an adequate amount of oil.

Debris on Cragg Hill Road It was reported that currently this road is fouled with lime slurry. Councillor Cook expressed the hope that road sweeping may improve as the District Council takes over road sweeping from the County.

It was resolved that these matters be considered by the Parish Council.

2. Matters arising:

- i) The cages placed around the shrubs on Main Street have not been a success. They are not sufficiently strong to stand up to strong winds and do not appear to deter vehicles from parking on the area. Therefore the Parish Council will inquire about the possibility of fencing the entire area.
- ii) Miss Foster asked Mr Hargreaves if he knew when construction of the new bridge would take place. Mr Hargreaves replied that the finance had been scheduled for next year, though there is always the possibility that something unforeseen would occur to delay the building of the bridge. Mr Hargreaves also said that he would ask the Highways Dept. about the bottleneck at Selside.

6. Chairman's remarks

After welcoming everyone, Mrs Millman thanked District Cllr. Cdr H H Cook for his regular attendance at Parish Council meetings and County Cllr. Mr R V Hargreaves for help and support. Miss Caroline Lambert was thanked for her diligent press reporting and Mrs Helen Sergeant was thanked for her work as clerk. A special thanks was due to Mr George Perfect, especially for his work on the Main Street Amenity Area.

Parish Records Loss of Enclosure Awards dating back to 1771 which are in the custody of the Parish Council are in the process of being repaired and restored. Photocopies will be kept in the Parish, and the originals will be stored in the District Council's offices in Skipton.

Leisure Swimming Pool £150 has been earmarked in the Parish Council's Budget as a donation towards the swimming pool.

Royal Wedding This had been marked by giving Royal Wedding Crowns to all children in the parish under 16. Mr Bentham presented the

Crowns to children attending Horton School.  
Planning applications These continue to be a subject which the Parish Council devotes much of its time to. Horton has recently instigated a meeting, which was held in Long Preston, which was attended by representatives of Parish Councils throughout the Craven area which have territory which falls under the jurisdiction of the National Park planning authority. Mr John Watson M.P. was present and addressed the meeting. The outcome of the meeting was that six representatives were chosen who will consult their own areas and discuss the problem, with a view to approaching the National Park.

7. Matters of general public interest

- i) Mr Colau said that his neighbour, Mr J White, had dug a ditch alongside his house last July and had not returned since. This ditch is a danger to passing traffic, in particular to vehicles which turn round at that point. Mrs Millman said that the Parish Council were sympathetic, and the meeting decided to write to Mr White on the matter.
- ii) Mr Hargreaves mentioned that a planning application for two dwellings behind the Village Hall had been refused by the National Park Authority.
- iii) Mr Colau has a 6ft. horse chestnut tree which he will donate to the parish. Mrs Millman thanked Mr Colau on behalf of the meeting. Mr Perfect will be asked to collect the tree and plant it.
- iv) Mr Perfect will also be asked to attend to an ash sapling planted on the Green.

Mr Hargreaves thanked Mrs Millman and the Parish Council for their work in the past year.


