WILLIAM LEYLAND of Malham. County of York.

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN, the fifteenth day of March Anno Domi 1690, I William Leyland of Malham within the Parish of Kirkby in Malhamdale in the Countie of Yorke Batchelor being sick and weake in bodie, and of sound and perfect memorie praise be given therefore to Almighty God, do make and ordaine this my present last will and Testament in manner and forme following (That is to say) first and principallie I comende my soule into the hands of Almighty God, And my bodie I comit to the earth, to be decently buried, At the descretion of my executrixes hereafter named, And as touching the disposition of all such temporall estate, As it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me, I give and dispose thereof as followeth, first I will that my debts and finerales charges shall be paid and discharged out of my whole goods, Item I give and bequeathe unto my mother Agnes Leyland Six pounds yearly, And everie yeare during the time and tearme of thirtie yeares, if the said Agnes Leyland my mother shall so long live, Three pounds of the said Sume to be paid at the feast of St Martin the bishopp in winter next after my decease, Three pounds more being the other halfe of the said sune, to be paid in like manner upon the Twentieth day of March next ensueing the day before mentioned, Item I give unto five of children of my sister Isabell Broadley; vid: Elizabeth, Agnes, Mary, Henry and Susanna, to everie one of them Six pounds Thirteen Shillings and fower pence, To be paid them, when each of them shall Accomplish the Age of Twenty one yeares, They giving a lawful discharge for same, And if anie of them die before the accomplished Age of Twentie one yeares,, that part to be divided equallie amongst the rest of my Sister Isabell children, Item I give unto my brother in law Michael Husband and his wife Alice my natural sister, and to fower of their children, vidz; Dorothy, Agnes, John and Henry, each of them Six pounds thirteen shillings and fower pence, when they Accomplish the Age of Twentie one yeares, And if anie of them die before they accomplish the Age of Twentie one yeares, That part to be divided; equallie amongst the rest of my brother Michaels children above named, And my brother Michael and his wife Alice my natural sister their bequest, to be paid unto them at Twelwe months end next after my decease, They all giving a lawfull discharge for same Item I give and bequest unto my Two Sisters Jennit Leyland and Agnes Leyland their Executors, administrators, and assigns All my houses gardens barnes buildings lands leases Tenements and hereditaments with th appurtenances, together with all writings and evidences touching or concerning the premises equallie betwixt them, upon codicon that they shall and doe pay all my debts and legacies before mentioned, Item all the rest and residue of my personall estate goods and Chattels whatsoever, I give and bequeath unto my Two loveing Ststers Jennit Leyland and Agnes Leyland equallie betwixt them to be divided, And do make them joynt executrixes of this my last will and testament being contained in one sheet of paper And I doe hereby revoke dissanull and make void all former wills and Testaments by me heretofore made, I declare and appoint this to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have here unto set my hands and seale the day and yeare first above written Sealed Signed and acknowledged in the sight and presence of John Atkinson Thomas Lawson Thomas Atkinson.
