Sir according to my speeche wth you at Hornbie touching Administracon upon thomas Milnar death who dyed very poor his goods not amounting to viij li, and ye debts wch he owght being much more besids v li which he ought to my Father by specialty & to my s[e]lf by lytle lesse for grownds & rents, wch debts to my Father and my I was ye more willing not to demaund, becaus he had benn long servant too us bothe, & that othert poor menn might have as farr as his goods would extend, & therfor according to ye said mylnar request at his death that certein pertienter debts and all that he could then remember (besids my Fathers & myn) he sett down and named, desyred me yt on Jacke Wilkynson (whom he putt in trust by my concent with three acers of comon being customary grownd & held of me to ye use of ye said mylnar children) migh also see as farr as he could that ye said poore menns debts wch he expressed might be (paid?) according herunto I entreated Mr Vicar of Clapham to cause ye said menn to meet who did most of them to whom was given three parts of their detts being all yt the goods would reach unto, and many of them being well pleased Som others are not herupon I am most earnestly to entreat your good favor & kyndenes to grannt administracon to Franncis Mylnar dawghter to the said Thomas mylnar and to ye forsaid Jacke Wilkynson by ye name of John Wilkynson alias Jack Wilkynson to thend that what he hath hytherto downe (indeed by my consent & pryvitie) may by the better in law, yf ther were any fault, p(?)I was a great caus therof and ytt was pius error in me for I served other mens debts and not my Fathers nor mye own. the cours of ye administracon I know nott and I thought ytt should have benne down ere now but I was out of ye country, yf ytt pleas you to send by this bearer any direction to Mr Vicar of Clapham to take bonds to your use or otherwise dyrect: I shall see ye dewties fully discharged and thinke my self much beholden unto yow. thus in too much hast as may appear by my wryting resting yours to my smal powr I comytt yow & us all to God his blessed pleasur lawekland this 25 of Januarie 1603
