Some introductory comments on Langeliffe Parish Council Accounts and Minutes:-

The general background to the period of the first part of the Langcliffe Parish Council Accounts and Minutes book (transcribed below) is explained in W.E. Tate's "The parish chest", 3rd edition, 1969. Churchwardens had responsibility for some civil matters at this time. Langcliffe township was only one of the five in Giggleswick parish. The "24" (p.18) would be the Giggleswick vestry. Besides the churchwardens (accounts up to 1767) there were three appointed officials; the overseer, the constable and the surveyor. Their accounts start in earnest in 1746 (p.7) after a brief previous mention.

The overseer was the principal executive servant of the vestry, and responsible generally for the management of the poor. In his hands was the actual business of assessments for the poor rate, which just prior to the commencement of this Langcliffe account/minute book amalgamated the many small rates for different purposes which were then raised. Not everyone paid up willingly (pp.30-32, 34).

The constable had a variety of duties including management of the parish's contribution to the Militia (p.50), responsibility for relieving distressed soldiers or mariners, or providing help for these when travelling on their way home (p.46, "a Navy man"). The constable was also responsible for apprenticing children (p.19), and removal of vagrants. A rate was gathered to pay pensions (p.17).

The surveyor (or waywarden as he was known elsewhere) was generally a duty done in turn by a representative of, for example, house rows. He would manage cash balances, fines, compositions and commutations, and collect these. He had to review roads, report back, attend highway sessions at a nearby town, fix days on which statute labour was to be performed, and supervise this – all for no pay (pp.38, 44, 45,47).

In earlier days the church may have held stock, and one responsibility of the churchwardens or constable, or even surveyor, was still the parish bull. There are several references to the local bull account (pp. 9,14,20).

There was clearly responsibility for the local kiln in the early years (p.1 and following), with a separate account, and the position of overseer and constable was shared (p.17). The yearly passing on of responsibilities and cash in hand of the various posts can be seen throughout. The early names listed are old familiar Langcliffe family names which occur in many other records. The time of the influx of workers to the new Clayton and Walshman cotton mill in Langcliffe is seen in the long lists of fresh names with money

due to the surveyor, 1790 (p.40) onwards. All the accounts, incomings and outgoings, get increasingly complex as time goes by (e.g. p. 25).

NB The original layout is approximated but monetary amounts written for example as 1:12:0,1"12"0,1-12-0 etc have been standardised as 1.12.0
