

7 Provisions & all other things necessary are supplied  
by the Governor of the Workhouse by direction &  
under the controul of the Visitor & Guardian of  
of the Poor of each Township; the Books are made  
up once a Month & each ~~Yearly~~ pays so much  
per head for every pauper he has had in during  
the preceding Month for Provision & <sup>according to the cost.</sup> ~~Fireing~~ House  
rent. Governors Wages, Medical attendance & other  
incidental expences, are paid by each Township accord-  
ing to the average of 3 years expediture previous to  
the incorporation taking place. Meal Flour & Butchers  
Meat are supplied <sup>to the house</sup> by contract for 6 months.  
~~each Township find clothes for their own Paupers~~

8 The Weekly cost <sup>per head</sup> of Paupers in the Workhouse  
has been during the last year from 1/10 to 1/11  
(Children under 9 years old 16 per head less) for  
Provision & Fuel. A Medical Man <sup>has a separate salary</sup> is paid by the

the Pauper belongs.

The Visitor & Guardians of the Poor ~~from repeated solicitation~~  
~~have~~ consented a few years ago with the approbation of  
the Magistrates to take in Paupers from some of  
the neighbouring Townships (which they have found  
to be of incalculable benefit inasmuch that they are now  
building for themselves a Workhouse) at the following rate

Settle to send to the Workhouse 6 paupers & pay 9/- per week for House Room & incidental expenses & the same rate for meat as the Paupers belonging to the incorporated townships. Giggleswick 3 Paupers at 4/6 per week Kettlewell 3 Paupers at 4/6 per week & Stainforth 4 Paupers at 6 per week.

9 We ~~do~~ allow relief out of the Workhouse in certain cases such as those who living at a distance & working in factories or at trades <sup>in</sup> which no employment could be obtained in the Township may be out of Work for a short time, or <sup>in cases of</sup> sickness or accidents, also to old or infirm People who by the kindness of their relations & neighbours are enabled to do with a less sum than they would cost in the Workhouse, the relief is given in Money or Clothes but no rents are paid. The Township of Lawkland lies in a farming district the Poor living within it are always in work with sufficient wages for their support, there are no roundsmen, as to the rate or allowance of relief that entirely depends upon the circumstances of the case after a careful Investigation.

10 We find it impossible to ascertain the ages of the out door Paupers on account of the great distance the most part of them live from us
