Thank you for your minute of the 19th November. I understand that you have had discussions on the possibilities of the use of this school as a Village Hall with the Clerk to the Horton-in-Ribblesdale Parish Council and with the Inspector of Further Education. There seems to be no doubt that the school could very easily be adapted to serve as an excellent Village Hall but the problem of finance, so far as its purchase and maintenance are concerned, is likely to be a formidable one.

For your own information, the Committee have in recent times agreed to the lease of a disused Primary School to a Parochial Church Council. The rent is £4 per annum and the Parish Church Council pay all rates and maintenance costs.

I should have thought that, providing the Horton-in-Ribblesdale Parish Council were prepared to follow a similar path, our Committee might be persuaded to agree to the leasing of the school to them at a nominal figure, providing the Parish Council were prepared to be responsible for any rates and maintenance costs. I shall be grateful if you will determine whether an arrangement of this kind is likely to be acceptable to the Parish Council.

If you would prefer to meet me before bringing the matter to the Parish Council, I shall be glad to do so and would meet you in Settle at some time suitable to yourself.



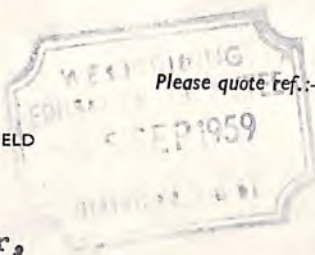

You are no doubt aware of the arrangement whereby the children from Helwith Primary School although attending the Horton-in-Ribblesdale C.E. School, are separately registered. This practice will cease, of course, when the Helwith Bridge School is permanently closed.

In the same way, for the purposes of the above return, we are required to submit separate Form 7 Schools for the Helwith Bridge children and for the permanent pupils at Horton-in-Ribblesdale C.E. School. I am, therefore, returning the Form 7 submitted in respect of the Church of England School which, from a comparison with last year's figure seems to include both sets of children, and should be obliged if you would have the separate Form 7 Schools completed as soon as possible. Two blank sets of forms are enclosed for this purpose.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. General.

This Form should be completed in triplicate in respect of each Primary and Secondary School (other than Nursery and Special Schools) maintained by the Authority. The completed copies should be returned through the Divisional Executive (if any) to the Local Education Authority, who should forward one copy to the Ministry of Education and one copy to H.M.I., if possible by 1st February, and in no case later than 14th February, 1960. A fourth copy of this form is supplied for retention by the school if so desired. Separate forms are required for each Department of a School.

2. School Name and Number.

The official name and number of the School should be given. The reference number of the Local Education Authority should not be entered in Section III.

3. Section I.

Schools should be recorded as **Multilateral or Bilateral only if they comprise throughout clearly defined selective (Grammar or Technical) and non-selective (Modern) streams which can be distinguished by the symbols G, T or M in Subsection A of Section III. Secondary schools which do not fall within any of the other categories should be shown as "Other Secondary."**

4. Section III.

General.

(i) Any School or Department with more than 19 classes or forms should use additional forms, in order to complete the information in A, B and C. In this case the total number on the registers and information under Subsections D, E, F, G, H, I and J should be entered on the final form only.

Pupils.

(ii) In Subsections C, I and J the pupils should be classified according to their ages on 31st December, 1959.

Classes.

(iii) The top class or form should be entered in the left hand column and the others in order from the left.

(iv) Subsection A: A class or form means a whole group of pupils within the responsibility of one teacher: i.e., the form or class master or mistress responsible for registration. An asterisk should be entered against the designation of every form or class which is usually split into smaller groups for teaching purposes, e.g., VIth forms, Vth form sets, etc.

Teachers.

(v) Subsections B, D, E, F, G and I are intended to show the normal staff of the School or Department. Therefore, teachers temporarily absent on the day of the return (e.g., through sickness) should be entered as though they were present, supply or relief teachers taking their places temporarily not being entered. If there is a recent vacancy, due shortly to be filled, enter particulars of the previous holder of the post. Teachers who are serving in Canada or the U.S.A. as part of the scheme for the exchange of teachers should be

entered as though present on the day of the return, Canadian or U.S.A. teachers taking their places not being entered. Other teachers absent or seconded for long periods for other duties should not, however, be entered, but their replacements should be entered instead.

(vi) The following symbols should be used in Subsections B, D and I:—

Q—Qualified teacher. S—Supplementary teacher
 T—Temporary teacher (approved as such under regulation 17 of the Schools Regulations, 1959.) U—Teacher, other than Temporary or Supplementary teacher, not recognised as Qualified teacher.

Sex should be indicated by the addition of "M" for male, and "F" for female.

Staff with Child Care Reserve or other approved qualifications who are taking the place of teachers should be denoted by the symbol "C.C."

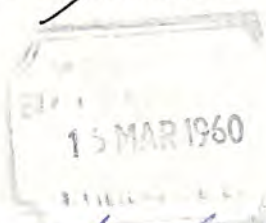

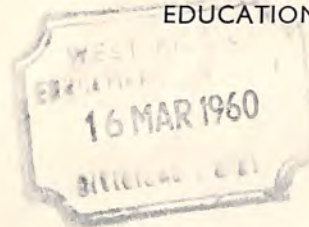
