Dear Sir,

I refer to a letter sent to you by Mr. J.D. Riddiough, Divisional Education Officer at Skipton, on 19th October, under the reference S.G.108/P. The subject of the letter was 'Horton in Ribblesdale CE (Aided) School - Head Teacher's Accident.' In his letter, Mr. Riddiough refers to three other communications on the subject, dated 10th and 25th March and 29th September. I have, as yet, had no reply to the query which he raised on my behalf. May I now be told your views, please?

The accident involved total write-off of my car, which, being an old one, was insured for third-party risk only. Nevertheless, it meant a considerable financial loss for me. I do realise that there is no obligation on the part of the L.E.A. to reimburse me in any way, but I was advised that in the circumstances the L.E.A. might well consider making some sort of financial gesture. The accident occurred as I was on my way to a session of the Bowland area Thorne Scheme Panel, on a particularly bad morning with a lot of ice and slush on the road. It was, in fact, the sort of morning when normally I would never have taken the car out of the garage, but I felt that one could hardly telephone and ask a group of children to go home and return on another day, when they were already keyed up with 'selection fever.'

I am still a member of this panel, which operates in a school to which I can get no form of public transport whatever. Inevitably, I shall be disinclined to take the risk of travelling by car during the coming sessions if road conditions are poor, as I can not accept such a financial burden again. Although by new car standards the capital value of an old car is small, this very fact makes the cost of comprehensive insurance for an old car prohibitive. I do hope that the County Education Committee will find it possible to offer some help.

Dear Mr. Riddiough,

I understand that you already know that I succeeded in writing off my car on the way to the Thorne Panel session in Bowland yesterday. The road conditions were awful, as you will remember, and had it been anything other than Thorne I would not have set off. However, I skidded in the slush and ice near Rathmell, at a narrow point in the road, and hit a stone wall. My car is scrap, as the chassis is twisted. The stone wall shows signs of impact, to say the least, and I understand from the police that although they are quite happy, the farmer wishes to claim compensation. As the car was an old one, I had third party insurance only, thus the matter is a total loss. This I accept, as it is pointless to pay out annual insurance cover which is almost as high as the nominal value of the car. Fortunately, I escaped with bruised hands and a few shaky feelings since! I was able to get a lift on a lorry to within a mile of the school, and was no more than 10 minutes late there, and carried on for the day. Mr. Dutton of Giggleswick School gave me a lift home.

Does the LEA offer any cover through its insurances to teachers who have accidents on journeys such as this? It is obviously going to prove rather costly and I would welcome any financial help I can get!

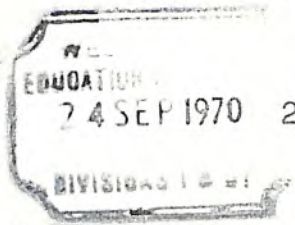

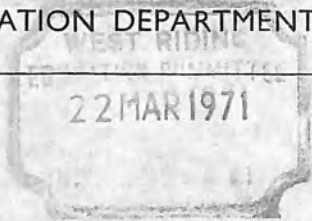



Dear Parents,

A few brief notes to end the term:

- (a) Easter Festival Service. Our thanks to everyone who attended and helped to make this a most reverent and enjoyable occasion. Please pass on our thanks to those of your friends who came with you. This was the kind of support that the children and the school need. I am very pleased to be able to tell you that the collection taken over tea after the service amounted to £5.15. This money has been given to the Church of England Children's Society.
- (b) Holiday dates. Next term begins on Tuesday, April 20th, 1971. We break up for the Spring Holiday on Friday, May 28th, and return to school on Monday, June 14th. The School Trip will be on Friday, July 2nd. On that day, the infants and those juniors not attending the trip will be on holiday. Term ends on Friday, July 16th. Autumn Term begins on Tuesday, August 31st, 1971.
- (c) School dinners. I hope that the increased charges will not lead to a drop in demand. The dinners at this school are of excellent quality and variety, and are far better for the children than are sandwiches or sweets. From next term, the charge is 12p per day. Thus, on the first day of next term, each child should bring 48p, and then 60p each Monday thereafter.
- (d) School dinners - reduced charges. You will be aware that reduced charges, or free meals, are available in certain cases, and I am by no means sure that every child who is entitled to a reduction in meal charges is receiving it. When charges rise after the holiday, there may be more cases. I have, in school, a chart showing the income scales and related school meals charges as from next term. If anyone would like to come and ask for details, in confidence, after the holiday, please do so. Note that before 'income' is calculated, various amounts are subtracted from your gross earnings. These are (i) the first £2 of injury or war pension, (ii) the first £2 of child's mother's earnings, (iii) N.I. contributions, (iv) income tax, (v) superannuation and graduated pension contributions, (vi) life insurance premiums, (vii) bus fares to work, Trade Union subs, other necessary expenses connected with work, (viii) rent, rates, mortgage payments. Remember; if you qualify, free meals are a right, not a charity. We do not differentiate at school between children whose parents pay for dinners and children whose parents do not.

For example: if your 'adjusted income' is £11.95 or less, and you have one child, his dinners are free; if it is £16.25 or less and you have three children, all their dinners are free; if it is £20.55 or less and you have five children, all their dinners are free. Above these income levels, you may find that some, if not all, of your children may have free dinners. The sliding scales allow for all sizes of family and levels of income. The size of family includes all children of or below school age, when cost of school-age children's dinners is calculated.


