and G. H. — I. K. and L. M. as fit persons to be Governors
of the poor for the said Township of Sawkland and do
agree to allow the person who shall be appointed Guardian
a Salary of _____ pounds per Annum for his trouble in

Appointed Governor of the said poor House a Salary of _____
for his trouble in executing that Office —
