Sirs,

I have searched the Rolls in this Office from the year 1777 to the year 1789. - There is only one Indictment against the Inhabitants of Lawkland which is for the nonrepair of a Highway in the Township of Lawkland leading from the town of Kirkby Lonsdale to the Town of Gisburn, to wit, for the space of 1680 yards in length and 8 yards in breadth at the Township of Lawkland from the North West End of a certain Building and Erection there called Eldreth Chapel to a certain gate there hung and standing across and over the same Highway at the Township of Lawkland called Chapman Bank Gate otherwise Garnett Brow gate -
