Horton is a parish and village in the northern division of the West Riding. Settle Union and County Court, District Ewcross, petty sessional division West District of Staincliffe and Ewcross wapentake. Craven Rural Deanery and Archdeaconry in Ripon Diocese. Church of St Oswald built in Stephen's reign in the Norman style - nave, transept, low square tower, 3 bells. Registers 300 years old in repair. Perpetual curacy annual value £110 in gift of Robert Holden MA and held by Rev Amos William Pitcher. Grammar school for boys and girls endowed by William (sic) Armistead with £160 p.a. Sunday School in schoolroom. Charities of £60 p.a. Blue Flag slate quarry. Picturesque scenery and caves.

John Foster Esq, James Farrer Esq and James Hammond Esq chief land-owners and lords of manor.

Grassland on limestone. Pop in 1861 - 417. 18,970 acres.
