I John Siggewick of Sampford of the parish of Gorton in the County of York shire in the County of York shire in bodye yet notwithstandinge of my minde and memorye prayeth for god doo make this my last will and testament in manner & forme as followeth, first and principally I doo give my soule to almighty god my mater and my bodye to be buried in the church of Gorton aforesaid, and all duties to be done for the same as the law doth require, from my minde and will is, that my debts & funerals expence be discharged and the rest of my goodes wiche I doo give to Agnes my wife And if my wife be wiche I doo, my minde and will is that she or her nexte or it be some or daughter shall have also wiche I doo of the goodes wiche I doo from the paymtes of my debts, from my minde and will is that Agnes my wife shall have the thirds parte of my tenement at Gorton wiche I have now in myne owne occupacion, And if my mater dye before Agnes my wife, my minde and will is that ~~the house~~ my wife shall have the thirds parte throughout all my tenement duringe her widows hood. from my will and minde is that Agnes my wife shall have the bringinge up of my some Thomas till she shall come at the age of xxij years, desiringe for the said Agnes my wife to bringe him up at the schools, if it please god that she will take learninge untill such times as she shall be able to write and read, from I make Agnes my wife my sole executor of this my last will and testament, from I make sup. vis. for the use of Adam Walter Richard Blomgess & Phillip Siggewick and Richard Siggewick, desiringe them that if any suite doo arise, that they shall sett it aside and make them good friends, these are witnesses Phillip & Richard Siggewick & Adam Walter

In the name of god Amen the Sixt day of Februarye 1613* I John Siggeswicke of Camhouses of the parishe of horton in Riblesdaile and in the Countie of yorke sicke in bodye yet nevertheles perfect in minde and memorye prayed be god doe make this my last will and testant in maner & forme as followeth First and principally I doe give my soule to almightye god my maker and my bodye to be buried in the Church or Churchyard of horton aforesaid, and all dueties to be done for the same as the law doth Require, Item my minde and will is, that my debts & funerall expences be discharged And the Rest of my goods which Remayneth I doe give to Agnes my wife And if my wife be wth Childe, my minde and will is that he or shee whether it be sonne or daughter shall have halfe with her of the goods which Remayne from the payinge of my debts, Item my minde and will is that Agnes my wife shall have the thirde parte of my tenement at Cam, which I have now in myne owne occupacon, And if my mother dye before Agnes my wife, my minde and will is that shee my saide wife shall have the third parte throughout all my tenement duringe her widowe head. Item my will and minde is that Agnes my wife shall have the bringinge up of my sonne Thomas till he shall Come at the aige of xxj yeares, desiringe her the said Agnes my wife to bringe him upp at the schoole, yf it please god that he will take learninge until such time as he the saide Thomas can write and read, Item I make Agnes my wife my whole executor of this my last will and testment. Item I make supervisors hereof Adam Battye Richard Cloinghe (?Cloughe) Philipp Siggeswicke and Richard Siggesweeke, desiringe them that if any suite doe arise, That theis shall sett it aside and make them good freindes, theis are witnesses Phillipp Siggesweeke Rich. daughter have xx marc(?) if she will remane and abide with my wif and my childer
to she be xxiiij yeres old and if she will not she for to have not somuch It[em] I orden
and makes my wif my hoole executure and she for to be ruler and hed of the farmhold
that she is nowe opon as long as she is content to abide opon hit It[em] I make my
lord thacket(?) of Greffray(?) Redman and Mister John his son sup[er]visors of
this my will desiryng them faith fullie to be good lordes and maisters to my childer
also I desire anthony Gibson William howson(?) aleyne proctor Thomas Batersby to
be good and faithfull frendes to my wif and childer as my trust is in them and to gif
them their best counsell when they nede of hit thes wittenes Sir Edmunde
Wy....stone p[re]st Thomas Batersby William Wildman
