

Lancliffe High Mill i.e. The Old Corn Mill.

The mill was once in the hands of the monks of Furness Abbey the dispute caused The Parish Boundary to be changed from the river to the MILL POND and back to the river via the By-Wash , as seen on old maps. To this present day boundaries are marked all along the River Ribble.

1780. The Mill was rebuilt under ownership George William Clayton, R.Walshman (Brother in law) who also ran Low Mill in Keighley.

1784. Completed building work by local men on piece work basis.
