

Lancliffe Paper Mill. 1794

Order of ownership: Monks/ Carr/ Salmon/ Roberts.

Possible site of corn mill connection, Furness then Sawley.
17th century cornmill of **Carrs** in this vicinity serving
Stainfoth and Langcliffe.

1652. Closure and then named Langcliffe Corn Mill. Possibly
a new mill replaced older ones in the area?

1793. Purchase of water corn mill and then called
Langcliffe Old Mill, by Robert Salmon of Hollingbourne,
Kent was converted to a paper mill. The middle complex nearest
to the road today, is supposedly the original mill.

1836. Partners John Hartley, Robert Rugg and John Salmon
were taken on by Robert Salmon. 'Fine paper still exists
bearing the **Rugg and Hartley.**'

1851. Sold to John Ovington of Skipton. (Fine press papers
from spinning.)

1860. Dam Bursts. The mill was bought by Hector Christie.

1880. The mill was leased to John Roberts who had paper
mills in Cumberland.

1919. The site was taken over by John Roberts and Sons.

Dec 1996-Jan 1997. New owner Robert Jubb Trading as John
Roberts Holdings.

The mill dam is now non-existent but evidence and traces are
visible.
