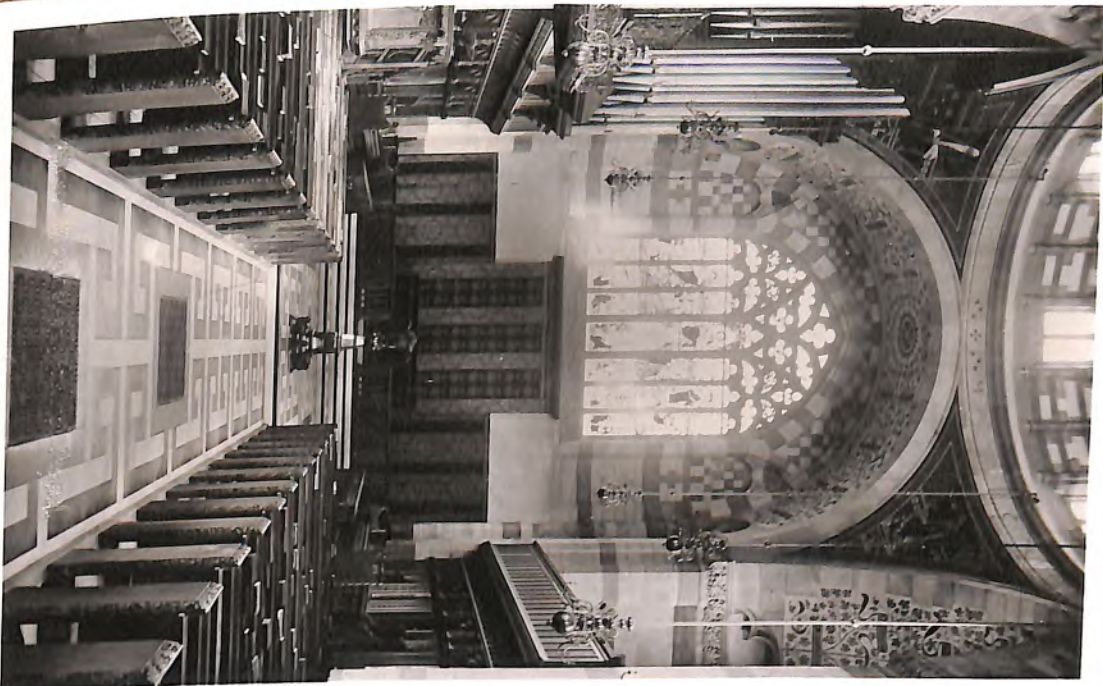

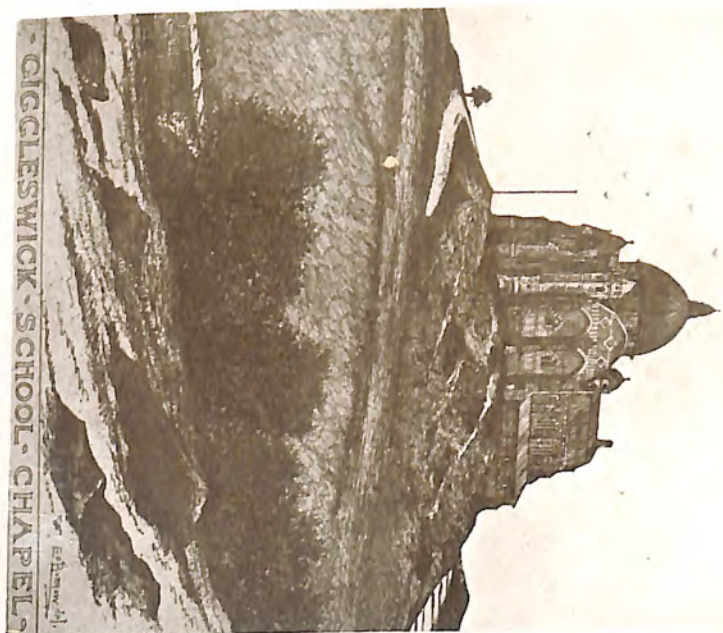

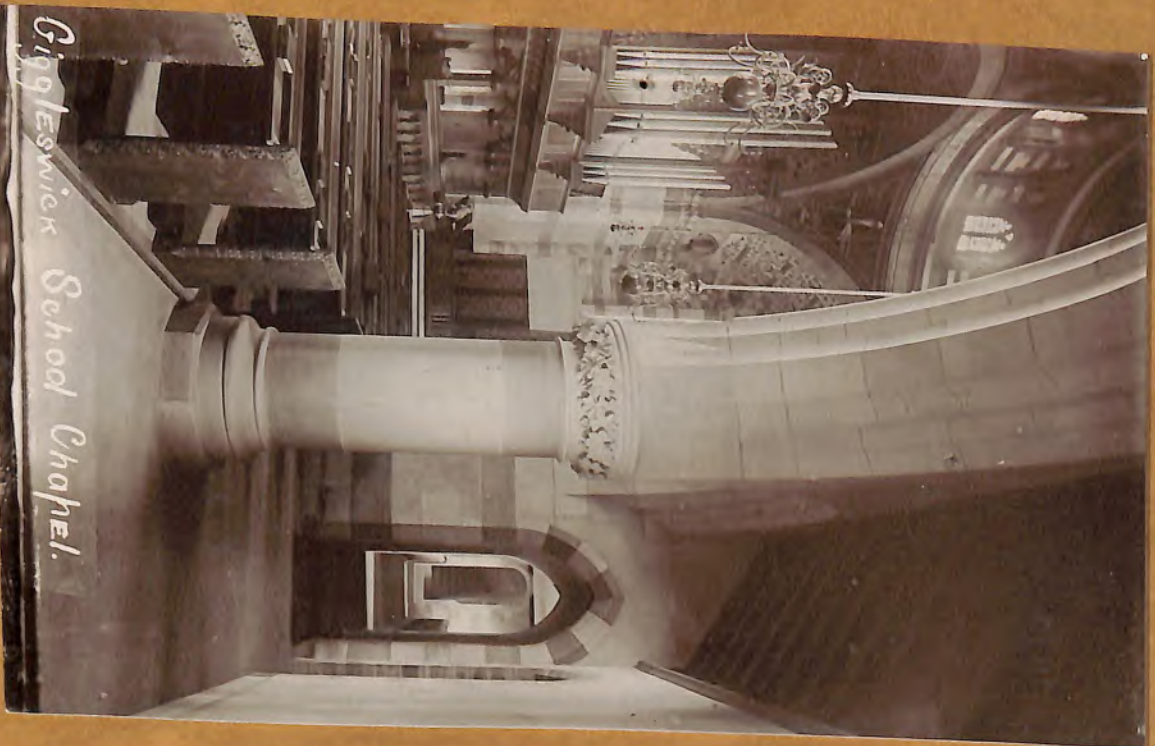

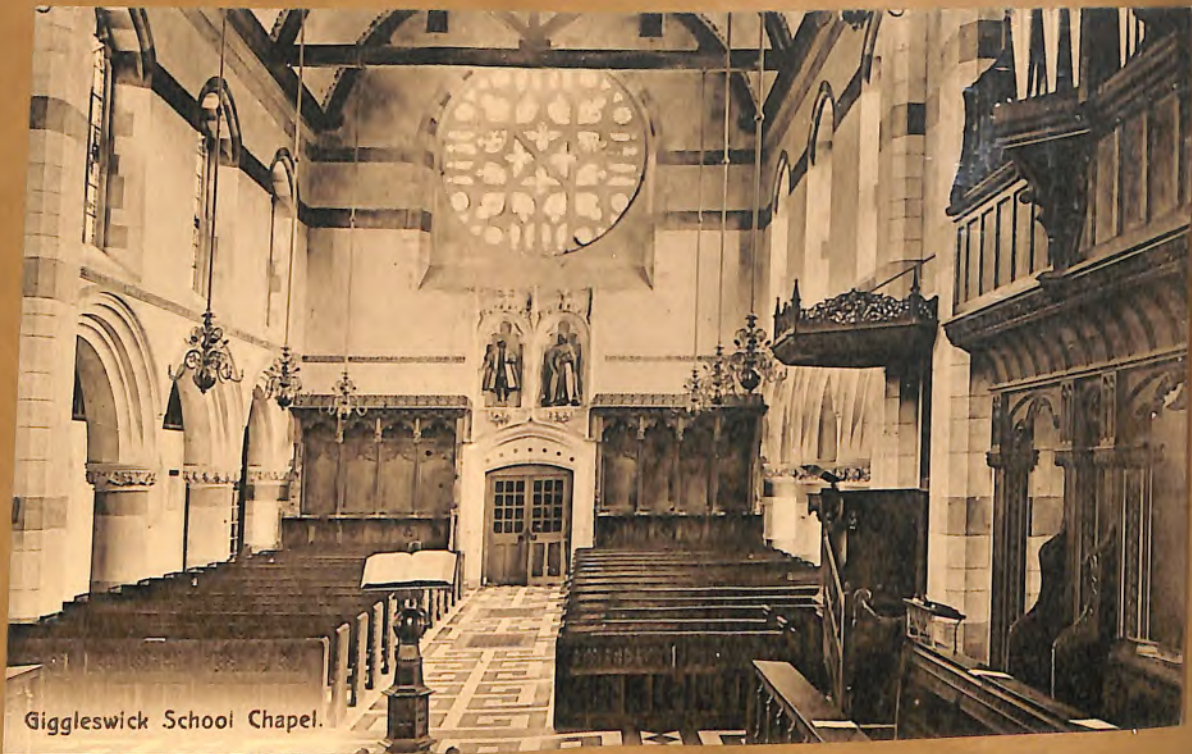

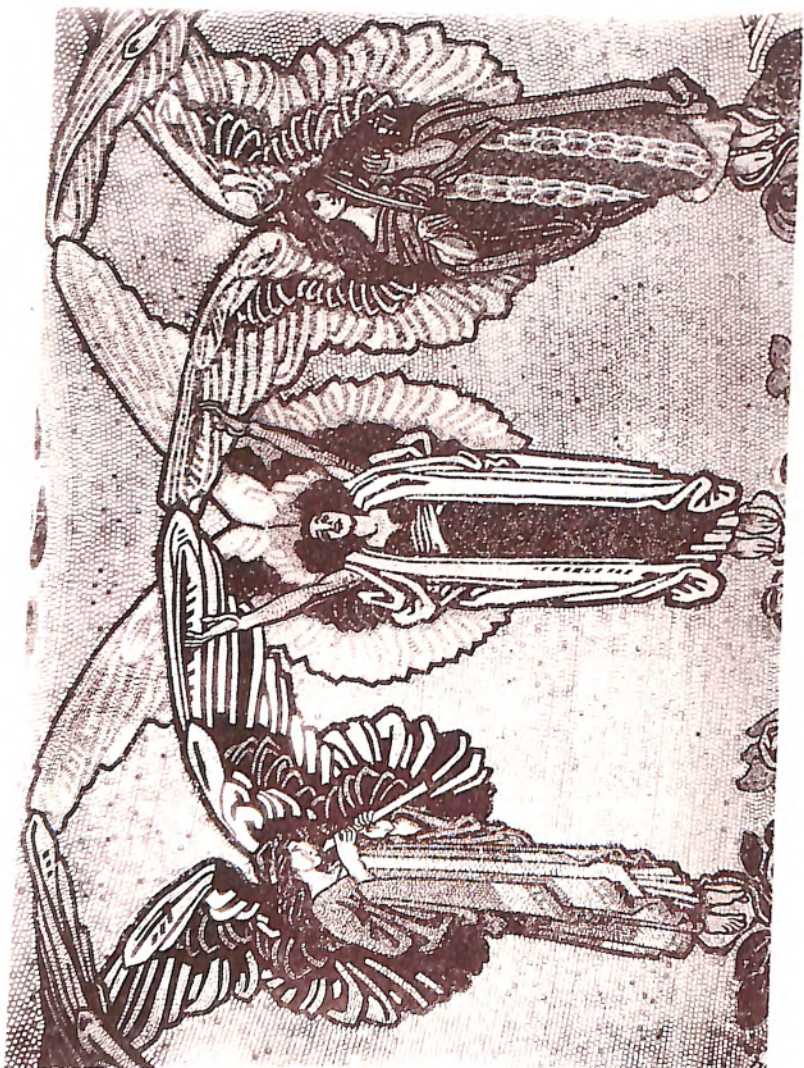

**WAR MEMORIAL.**

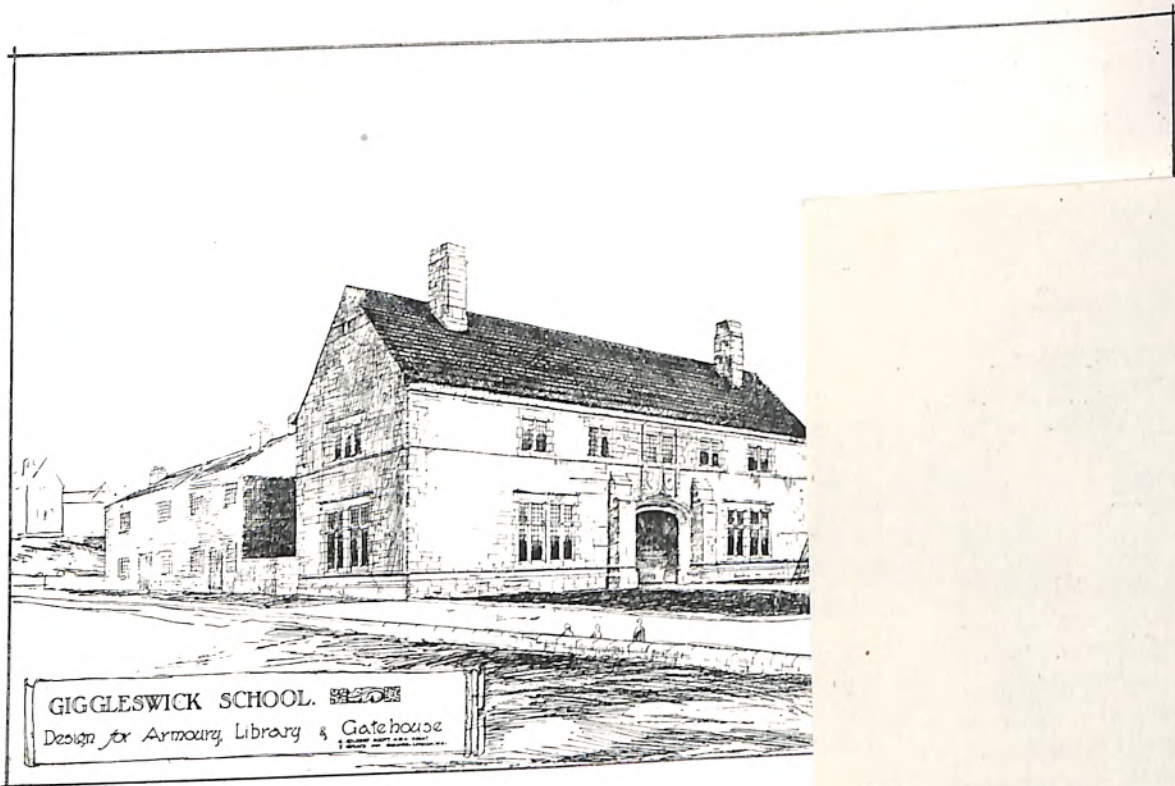
Dear

It is proposed to erect a memorial to those Old Boys of Giggleswick who have lost their lives in the war as a consequence of service in one of His Majesty's Forces. To our knowledge they number now 86 and there are probably many others of whose death we have not received notice. So great a sacrifice should obtain a suitable Memorial in the School, and one which should be permanent, to stand as a reminder of the noble sacrifice and glorious example of the past sons of Giggleswick, and an inspiration for all future generations.

It is further proposed to record as part of the memorial the names of all those Old Boys and Masters who have served during the War, and thus to make a fitting acknowledgment of their readiness to serve their King and Country.

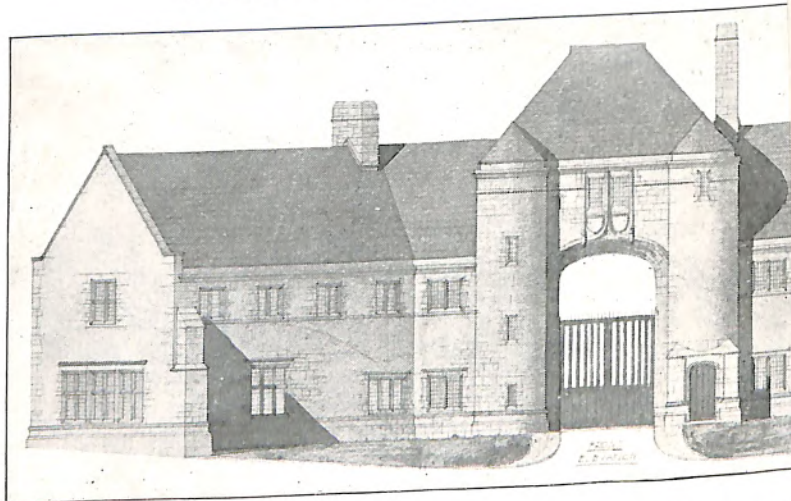
The Governors of the School have considered several proposals; and the scheme which they approve and recommend is one for erecting a block of buildings comprising an Entrance Gateway, an Armoury for the O.T.C. and a Library, the extent of the building to depend on the amount of money subscribed. The School-buildings would be greatly improved by a handsome Gateway and a better approach: the Armoury is much needed to replace the present inadequate provision for housing the arms, etc., of the O.T.C. and would be an appropriate feature of a War Memorial: while, if the amount of funds subscribed enables a good School Library to be included in the proposed Memorial, this would be a great acquisition. It may prove necessary to incur some expense in providing the site and laying out the road of approach.
