HORTON VILLA.

We think that our house is late Victorian. The initial document of the deeds is a conveyance of a cottage called Horton Villa in 1910 to a Robert Redmayne who had been previously renting it. It has a Dent marble fireplace in one of the front rooms. In the 1980's Selbergh National Park offices had a display which included a bit about Dent marble being popular in late Victorian times. The front rooms have internal shutters. The staircase has decorated balusters - square top & bottom with a rounded pattern between with bigger posts at the top, bottom and turn of the stairs which is Victorian in design.

Our house appears to be similar to Powe Cottage. Both houses have the same pattern of windows at the back, but we do not have stone mullions at the front. However, we have dressed stone at the front and one side wall, the south side. Powe Cottage is sideways to the road and the equivalent wall to our south wall, faces the road.

The house originally had a 7'6" yard at the back, enclosed by a stone wall. The owners who sold the house to us in 1985 (descendants of

Robert Redmayne) had bought a plot of land from the Golden Lion Outdoor Activity Centre (as the pub was then) to make a garden.

The barn next to our house was made into a garage in 1999. Mr Chris Sutcliffe told us that it had previously been used as a cobbler's shop. The north wall was demolished & rebuilt to include the double doors. The north west corner of the west wall had also to be rebuilt as a privy had been inserted - with brick walls and a wooden seat with ~~two~~ holes, one small & one large. The steps on the west side were added to allow entry to the top floor. The original entry to the top floor being inside up a ladder. The door at the top of the stairs was made from an original window ~~the~~ ^{one} new windows & two roof lights were added to the top floor. The downstairs is as it was, apart from the double doors. The downstairs window has been glazed, the doorway in the south wall was the original entrance. The north end of the floor is concrete, the rest being the original slate flags. The driveway is crushed stone with no membrane as the National Park official said that we must ensure that water could get to the roots of the Yew tree next door. Mr Chris Sutcliffe told us that it is the oldest house in Horton.
