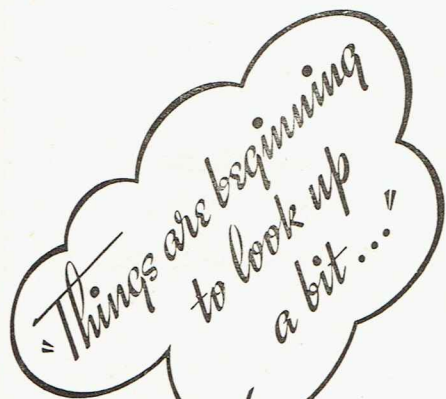

'They'll come . . . . some day,' smiled her married friend."

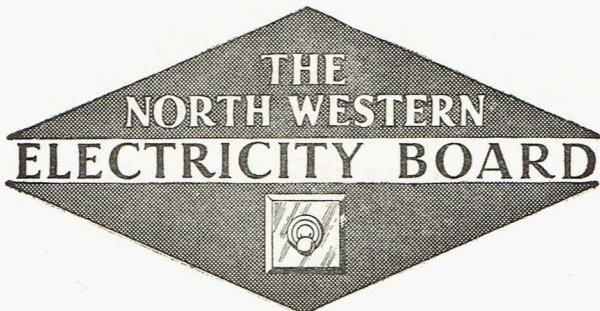
"But *when* IS 'some day'?" sighed the girl in green.

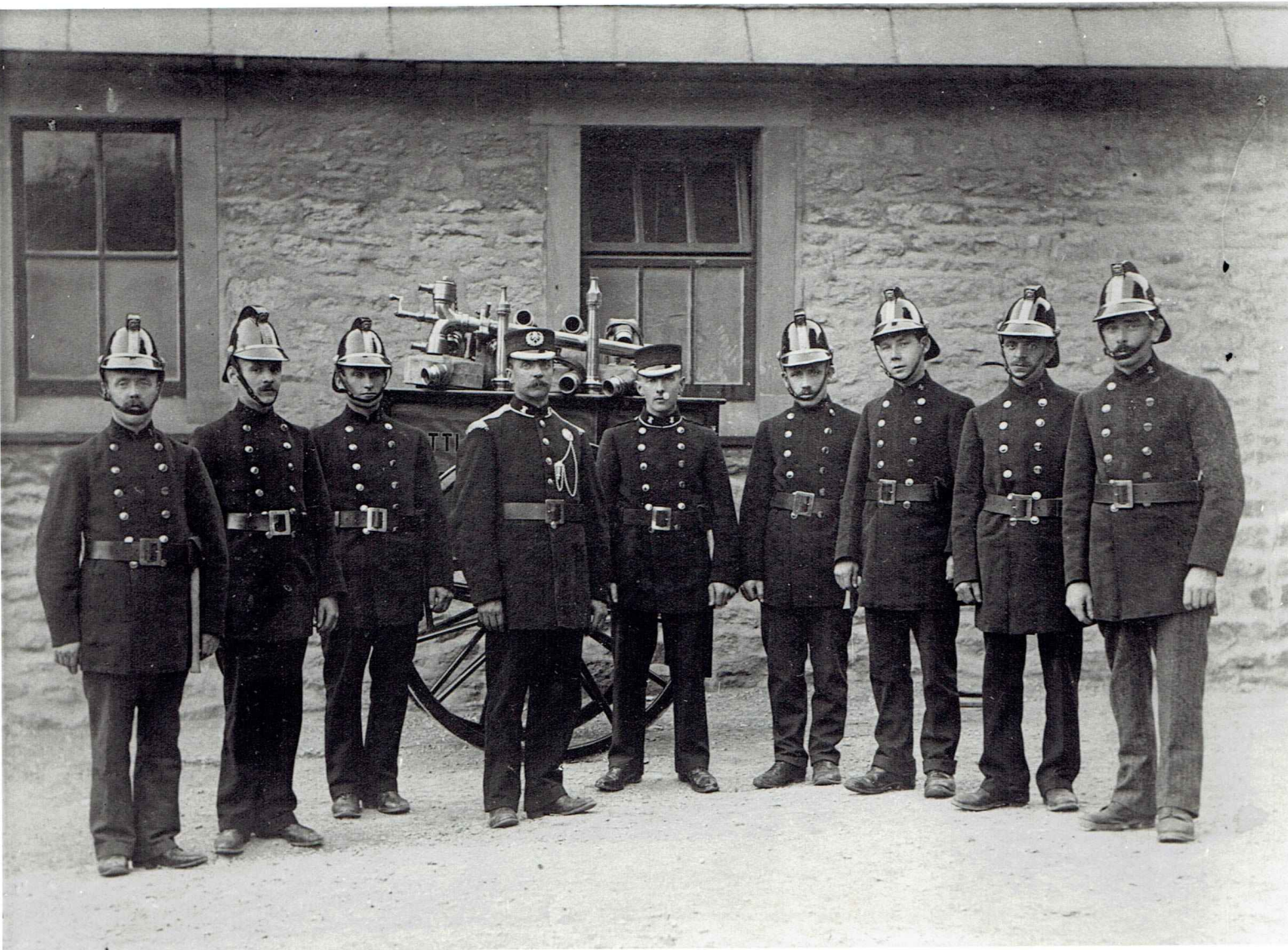
