King's grace of the County of Dorset in the manors of Dorchester
some shillings hereof and a penny and one half of pence and so
to be in full satisfaction of the said Henry and Delivance's debt
hereafter grew due and payable to the said King's grace of the County
of Dorchester and then the said Henry and Delivance were present

 Agreements, covenants, promises, conditions and written in one paper of Indentures bearing date with these
 parties and made betwixt the above bounden Edmund Boate and Mary his wife of the one part and
 the above named John Dugstall of the other part as the same on the part and behalf of the said
 Edmund Boate and Mary his wife their heirs Episcopus et alii and assigns, every of them and ought to
 be observed kept according to the true intent and meaning of the said Indentures and that this obligation
 to be void or else to remain in force. * *
