depend the Curation or Guardianship of the person and portion of Thomas  
scobiggin — a Minor of the age of seven or eight years and upwards  
the natural and lawful son — of Anthony scobiggin late of Newcaudouse  
the county aforesaid and Diocess of York deceased — according to the first  
Choice and Election of the said Minor lawfully made of you the aforesaid  
Jouest scobiggin — before the Reverend John Allott Clerk our lawful  
surrogate and we do by these presents constitute you to be Curatrix or Guar-  
dian of the said Minor and of all his Effects Goods portions Regaries and Rights  
whatsoever and we do ordain and appoint you Administratrix of the  
same for the sole use and Benefit and during the Minority of the said Minor  
and not otherwise having first taken the oath according to Law in that  
required before our & surrogate — saving the Right of every other per-  
son giving at York under the seal of our said Office this eleventh day of June  
in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty two.
