made the thirtieth Day of March in the Twenty Ninth Year of the Reigne of our Sovereign Lord George the second by the Grace of God of Great Brittain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and so forth and in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred Fifty and Six **Between** John Green of Mildam in the Parish of Dorton in Ribblesdale in the County of York Esquires of the one Part and Thomas Cowbiggin of Stevenagehouse in the said Parish and County aforesaid Yeoman of the other Part **Witnesseth** that for and in Consideration of the Sum of five Shillings of good and lawful Money of Great Brittain to the said John Green in hand paid and immediately before the dealing and Delivery of these Presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John Green **hath** granted Bargained and sold and by these Presents **Doth** Grant Bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Cowbiggin his Executors Administrators and Assigns Two Cattelgates or Sheargrasses or Shearbage and Grasping for two full Acres more or less with the Ground and Soil thereof in upon and throughout all that shuted Pasture commonly called or known by the Name of the Low Moor situate lying and being within the Parish of Dorton in Ribblesdale aforesaid together with all and singular Ways Pastures Waters Watercourses and other Tenements and other Rights Liberties Profits Privileges Advantages Hereditaments and appurtenances whate soever to the said two Cattelgates or Sheargrasses and Premises belonging or in any wise appertaining and the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Remainders and all yearly and other Rents Issues and profits thereof and of every part thereof **Do have and to hold** the said two Cattelgates or Sheargrasses with the Ground and Soil thereof and all and singular other the Hereditaments and Premises herein before mentioned and intended to be hereby granted Bargained and sold and every part thereof with their and every of their Rights Members and appurtenances unto the said Thomas Cowbiggin his Executors Administrators and Assigns from the Day next before the Day of the Date of these Presents for during and unto the full end and Term of one whole year from thence next ensuing and fully to be completed and ended **Yielding and paying** therefore unto the said John Green his Executors or Assigns the Rent of one Pepper Corn on the last Day of the said Term if the same shall be then lawfully demanded to the End Intent and Purpose that by Virtue of these Presents and by force of the Statute made for transferring of Lands into Possession the said Thomas Cowbiggin may be in the Actual Possession of all and singular the said Premises and be thereby enabled to accept and take a Grant and Discharge of the Reversion Residue and Justices thereof to him and his Heirs for ever in such like manner and form as in and by our Indenture of Release intended to bear Date the Day next after the Day of the Date of these Presents and to be made between the said John Green and Jane his Wife of the one Part and the said Thomas Cowbiggin of the other Part the same shall be granted Released and Conveyed **In Witness** whereof the said Parties to these Presents their Hands and Seals have hereunto interchangeably set the Day and Year first above written
