Aug. 30<sup>th</sup>

J. Janet Berry. Trained. Cert. Tchr. and Suppl. Tchr for W.R.C.C. arrived at this school at 8<sup>a.m.</sup> 35 to take charge according to instructions from Mr. Horne - but found Mr. Hatfield did not conclude his engagement until 4 p.m. It is his sixty-fifth birthday today, and he is now entitled to his pension.

Aug 31.

Took up the duties of H<sup>d</sup> Teacher. I find the children very tractable. The speaking, reading, and recitation of the children is so low and indistinct as to be almost inaudible.

Sep 1.

The desks and window sills were thick with dust this morning, and the school presented an uncared-for appearance.

Two of the eldest girls were appointed to dust the desks and a boy to remove all the broken glass (from a picture broken in transit) lying in a window

Sep 2.

St II have no idea of the Elementary Rules of Arithmetic. It will be necessary to begin with the simplest work suitable for St I to get the children to exercise any reason. They attempt to subtract a large number from a smaller one.

Sep 5.

Gave a writing lesson to the whole of the Upper School - St II & upwards. (Flowing Hand.)

Sep 7.

Have looked through previous pages of this book to find the last report but failed to do so.

Sent to the Vicarage, and the Vicar found the last Report - dated Aug. 1909. This had not been copied into the Logbook. It was received Oct. 8. 1909.
