A *Memorial* of an Indenture bearing Date the Fourth Day of February in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred made *Between* Robert Foster of Newhouses in the Parish of Horton in Ribblesdale in the County of York Gentleman of the one part and Thomas Stackhouse of Stainforth under Bargh in the Parish of Giggleswick in the said County of York Gentleman of the other part and is *Of and concerning* all that Close within the Township of Stainforth under Bargh aforesaid called & commonly known by the name of **Catterigg** now in the Occupation of him the said Thomas Stackhouse and containing by Estimation **Twelve Customary Acres** or thereabouts be the same more or less the said Indenture is Witnessed by William Carr the Elder of Stackhouse in the parish of Giggleswick aforesaid Gentleman and William Carr the Younger of the same place Gentleman

A Memorial of an Indenture of Feofment bearing date the thousand Eight Hundred and Seven and made Between the Right honourable Thomas Philip Weddell Lord Grantham of Newby Hall in the West Riding of the County of York of the First part John Hartley of Settle in the County of York Gentleman and William Sutcliff of the same place apothecary of the Second part and Giles Redmayne of Settle aforesaid Mercer an attorney therein mentioned to make Livery and Seizin of the third part Of and Concerning all that Close Inclosure piece and parcel of Land called and Usually known by the **Name of Dryporker otherwise the Dry Park and Intack** situate lying and being within the Township and Near to the Village of Stainforth in the County of York and are parcel of the Lands and possessions of the Manor and late dissolved Monastery of Sawley in the County of York and contain Together **thirteen acres three Roods and twenty five perches Customary Measure** be the same more or less and now or late in the Tenure or occupation of Robert Yeadon as tenant or Farmer thereof Together with the appurtenances the Exemption of which said Indenture of Feofment by the said Thomas Philip Weddell Lord Grantham is witnessed by the Honorable Frederick John Robinson of Newby Hall aforesaid Esquire and John Crowder of Brotherton in the County of York aforesaid Esquire and the Execution thereof by the said John Hartley is witnessed by Cuthbert Singleton and Christopher Beverley both Clerks to the said John Hartley
