30th April, 1714, John Johnson, of Wharfe, in the parish of Clapham, yeoman, conveyed ; -
"all that parcel of ground as the same is now fenced out . . . within the precincts of
Wharfe and hereto used, sett apart and imployed for a burying place. . . . containing
twelve yards square adjoining on West Side to highway called Fleet Lane and on the East
to a certain close called f fleet " to
