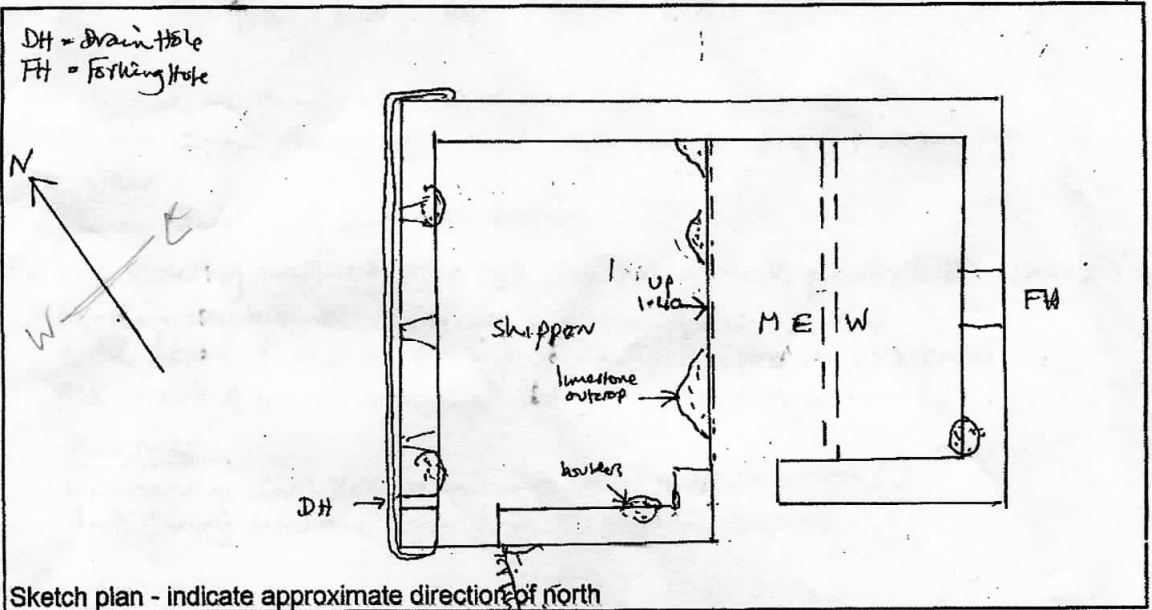

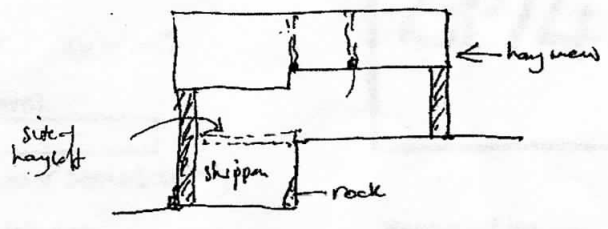

Barn of "bank barn" form with haymow over-skipper in Cornish style. Possibly cruck built c. 1600 or earlier. E. 18^c roof truss

Exterior

Large double plinth at l.w., w., ead. Square ventilators. W gable shows change of quoins and possible steeper thatched roofline.

Interior

Broken remains of dark slate bookies

Roof trusses of morticed apex type with raking struts, perhaps E 18^c. Member '1' x '11'
 Re-used cruck timber includes a portion of a cruck blade; a tie beam of a cruck purlin; 2 principal rafters of cruck blades one joint of which is mortised halving and perhaps nodeval.

Materials

limestone quoins; slaty sandstone lintels (Sandford sandstone?)
 Thick flaggy sandstone roofing flags in graded courses.
