

Minutes of a meeting held on January 18th 1993 at 7.00p.m. in the Endowed School.

Present: Councillors Mr K Jowett (Chairman), Mrs B Berry, Miss K M Foster, Miss S J Haywood, Mrs S M Millman and Mr D A Morphet.

In attendance: District Cllr Mr M Riley, Mr C Armstrong.

1. Apologies for absence were received from Mr C Floyd (illness)
2. Minutes of a meeting held on December 14th 1992 were confirmed as a correct record. SMM/BB

3. Matters arising

- i) Mrs Berry asked if the National Park had explained why their decision on the Golden Lion planning application was in conflict with the Parish Council's recommendation; they have not done so.
- ii) The trees have been planted on Murray Hill, and the grant from the National Park has been applied for.
- iii) Mr J Morphet has phoned Mr Jowett and asked him to meet at Selside tomorrow to discuss the village green. X
- iv) Mrs Berry has passed on her Neighbourhood Watch file to the police.
- v) Mr Jowett has spoken on the phone to Mrs Rogers about the proposed Pennine Bridleway. Landowners have turned down her proposals, so she is now looking into a new route via Foxup. X

4. Accounts

Bank balance = £905.84

It was resolved (i) to pay the following: SMM/DAM

- i) £248 to D Oversby (ch 100230) for fencing for Murray Hill.
- ii) £5 to Ingleton Parish Council (ch 100231) as a contribution towards the running costs of the Joint Footpaths Committee.

5. Planning

- i) A letter has been received from Mr J Cawley, National Park planning officer, asking for the Council's views on the use of a piece of land by the Crown bridge for storing vehicles and equipment by Mr C Armstrong. The Council felt that this should be allowed to continue as Mr Armstrong has grown up in the village and created a successful livelihood for himself here rather than having to move away to find work. He also serves a local need. Mrs Millman pointed out that the plan supplied is wrong and shows too large an area. A corrected plan will be sent to Mr Cawley. Also it was felt that "parking of agricultural equipment" would have been better wording.

6. Precept 1993-4

It was resolved (ii) to precept the Craven District Council for £2886. Included in this are allowances for property repairs (£150), grass cutting (£100) and a donation to Settle Swimming Pool (£200). SJH/SMM

7. Dog bye-laws

A meeting has been arranged with officers from Craven District Council to discuss possible bye-laws for the control of dogs in the village on January 27th. at 11a.m. outside the school.

8. Craven District Arts Development Plan

A letter has been received from Craven DC and Mr Riley gave the meeting further details of the proposals. It was decided to wait to see what further developments took place.

9. Road Safety

The recent accident on the Golden Lion corner involving a laden wagon was discussed. Although councillors could not think of anything which could have prevented this accident, it was decided to ask Mr Craven to meet Mr Jowett to look at the situation. Also to ask the Highways dept. if they could expedite the white line painting on the corner.

10. Best Kept Village Competition

It was decided not to enter the competition this year.

11. Correspondence

- i) A letter has been received from the North Yorkshire Probation Service asking the Council if they know of any tasks in the parish which would be suitable for work for people serving a Community Service sentence. Councillors welcomed the opportunity to provide projects for this scheme, and suggestions were painting the Village Hall, tidying the beckside, painting the school, draining the school field and cutting the roadside verge leading up to Brackenbottom. The clerk will contact the appropriate chairman etc., and reply accordingly.
- ii) Mr Avison has written keeping the Council informed of the progress of the car park, Tay Bridge and Studfold Bridge projects.
- iii) Mr David Curry MP has written with copies of the correspondence with the National Park on issues raised by the Parish Council. It was decided to let Miss Haywood see this correspondence and then compose a reply to Mr Curry.
- iv) Also received this month:
 - a) Letter of thanks from the Settle-Carlisle trust.
 - b) North Yorkshire CC have sent a copy of their submission to the Local Government Commission.
 - c) Craven DC Waste Recycling directory

12. Any other business

People have been abseiling from the footbridge by the Crown again and some of the spars are missing. The clerk will point this out to Mr Craven, and ask for signs to be placed on the bridge prohibiting abseiling.
