

and Helton Ox Pasture shall be two yards high one yard broad at the Bottom and shall have fourteen through Stones in every Rood. Seven of which through Stones shall be laid at the height of two feet from the ground at which height the said several walls and fences shall be two feet broad that the other seven through Stones to be placed in each Rood shall be laid at the height of four feet from the ground. and that the said walls be gradually tapered from the through Stones first laid in the said walls as aforesaid and the breadth of fourteen Inches at the East at the Top thereof and we do further order and direct that the several and Respective person and Persons to whom any allotment or Allotments Plots or Plots of Ground is or are therein before set out, his ~~her~~ Water from any Spring Riverlet Stream or pool in the Allotment or Allotments of any other of them by a small cut or Canal to be made from such Spring Riverlet Stream or pool into the Allotment or Allotments of him her or them who shall stand in Need thereof so as Water sufficient shall be left for the use of the person or persons from whose Allotment or Allotments such


Water shall be so conveyed and that all and every such person and persons as aforesaid and their several and Respective heirs Executors Administrators or assigns and Successors shall have full and free Liberty to make Drains and from time to time to open and cleanse the same from his ~~her~~ or their ~~several~~ several and Respective Allotment or Allotments through the Allotment or Allotments of any other person or persons for carrying off the Water from the Allotment or Allotments of the person or persons making such Drains doing as little damage as may be by the making and cleansing such Cuts or Canals and Drains and we do also order and direct that all and every person and persons who are hereby required to make any of the said walls or fences and was already have or shall hereafter dig for or get Stone in the Allotment or Allotments of any other person or persons for the making such walls or fences or any part thereof shall and they are hereby respectively required on or before the second day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy three / to through the Earth Soil or Rubbish which now is or shall be here after dug up in the Searching for or getting of such

Stone back again into the holes or Quarries from which the same hath already been or hereafter shall be dug up in order to level the said holes and Quarries as near as may be with the Surface of the Ground adjoining thereto, and lastly we do hereby order and direct that all and every person or persons to whom any Allotment or Allotments is or are here in before set out on the said pasture called Helton ooc pasture the Duke of Devonshire and the Curate of the Chapel of Thomtwaite only excepted shall in proportion to the number of Cattle gates they were respectively intituled to on the said Helton ooc pasture at the time of the execution of this our Award. Erect and make the fence between the Respective Allotments of the said Duke of Devonshire and John Ellis and the said Out Moor, otherwise Common Head, and shall also make erect ~~maintain~~ and support a Gate with such <sup>posts</sup> ~~posts~~ as aforesaid in the fence between the said John Ellis's last mentioned Allotment and the said Out Moor otherwise Common Head which said fence against the Out Moor otherwise Common Head (except such parts thereof as divides the Allotment of the said Duke of Devonshire there from) shall be maintained by all the owners

and proprietors for the time being of the Several Allotments on the said Helton ooc pasture in such proportion as aforesaid and that the Division fence between the Allotment of the said Duke of Devonshire and the Out Moor otherwise Common Head after the same shall be so made shall be repaired and supported by the Duke of Devonshire his heirs and Assigns forever, In Witness whereof we the Commissioners above named have to the last twenty four Skins of this our Award the whole thereof being contained in twenty five Skins parchment set our hands and to the first Skin thereof to which all the others are affixed our hands and Seals the twenty seventh day of in the twelfth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third by the Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and so forth and in year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Seventy one.


