death on the fields of my tenement.

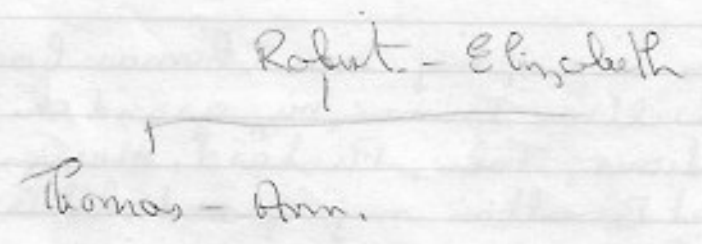
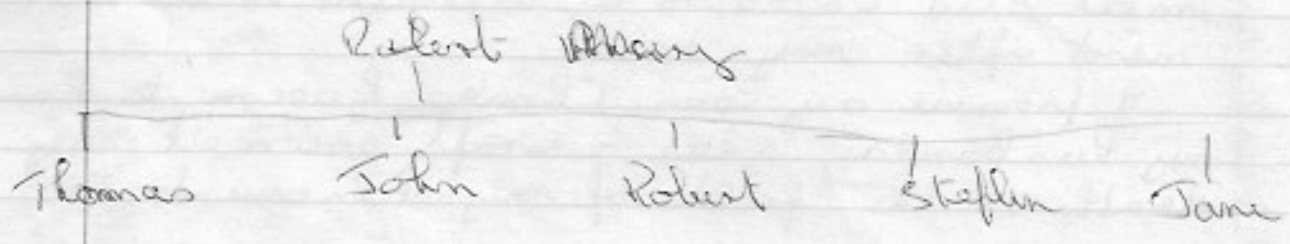

The owner should mean Michael William Vernon
Maude born 12/2/1917 grandson of the second Testator

Farm house with the barns sheds stables and
other buildings and the plantations and closes of land
thereto belonging containing altogether 172.074 acres
or thereabouts and known as Boxons Farm Biscou
near Skipton in the County of York. Together with
fourty sheep gates on Biscou Fell
Registered at Wakefield 15th Feb 1938.
