Glossary

acre	formerly a measure of arable land,
assart	land cleared of trees - woods - & cultivated either for arable or pastoral use.
balk	area of uncultivated land left between furrows along which access to the holdings in the common field was possible. Technically defined as a boundary strip.
beck	strip of uncultivated land, can apply to land surrounding the fields or to a division within it
bote	land cleared from woodland for cultivation
bovate	technically the holding of a villein in a common field. The wide variation in the area of land termed a bovate suggests it is a unit of land-holding and not a specific measurement
butt	name given to selions or strips which meet the furrow or field boundary at an angle
bydale	local name for a furrow.
close	enclosed piece of meadowland held in severalty or individually
croft	piece of arable land enclosed and farmed by the individual.
culture	used to describe cultivated land, frequently used instead of furrow.

dole name frequently applied to area of common, villain meadow land.

fall ploughed land, same meaning as fur long

paugh local term for fur long

field prepared ground either open or enclosed and used for either arable or pasture.

fit grassland on a river or stream bank.

flat ploughed land, same meaning as fur long.

forland same as headland.

fur long group of individual parallel sections, the arrangement of fur long within the field system is governed by the local geography.

gore irregular shaped piece of land.

headland raised ridge at the top and bottom of and at right angles to the parallel sections in a fur long (balke) in documents.

intake piece of land taken in from the waste for cultivation

land individual arable strip in common field

organg same meaning as air gate

ran or ran of different origin, but both mean a piece of

waste → technically a boundary strip.

rood or rod technically a quarter of an acre, but like the bovate and virgate, it is commonly used as a descriptive word for land measurement without being specific.

royd common north country word for land cleared of bearing trees and wood, name frequently given to assarts.

selion from Latin, it means the same as a Middle English land.

shot or skelt another name for furlong.

syke watercourse of broad shallow profile.

Taft when referring to the fields, it means an enclosed piece of cultivated land. It is commonly used when describing individually worked piece of land, not in the common field system.

virgate in northern England it refers to the holding of a wellin in the common field. It varies in size but is traditionally about 30 acres.
