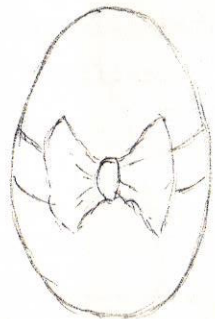


Perhaps there is no answer to that riddle - but there is an answer to the next one!

Because the egg is the symbol of New Life, and at Easter we think of the new life of Jesus.

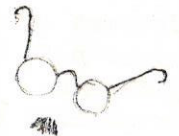
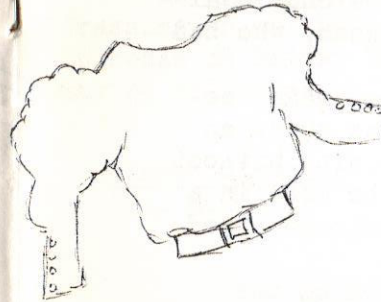

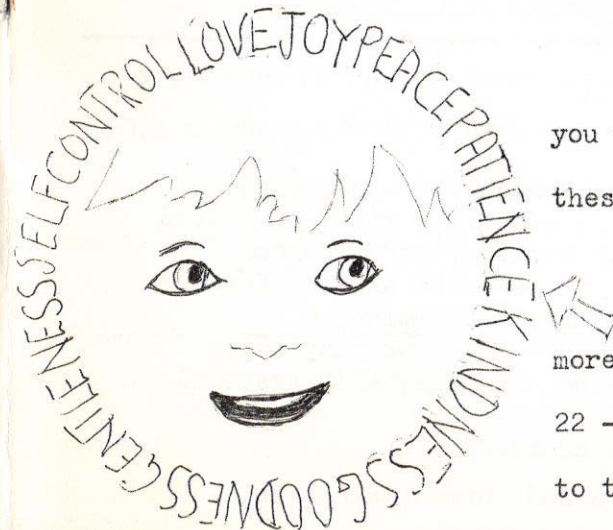

STAMPING FEET IN GRASSINGTON

One of the projectors used in the Devonshire Institute for film shows is now to be seen in the Grassington Museum. The shows ceased in 1964, when the audiences, despite the installation of a wide screen succumbed to the Goggle Box.

The first cinema in Grassington was in 1923, when second-hand equipment from Bradford was installed. It was hand wound and not very good. The following year two new Bauer projectors were bought, better films projected and the entertainment improved. The talkies came in 1928, but the cost of sound was beyond local resources, so the hall was let to Mr. Graham, who had the cinema in Settle.

The equipment was second-hand or home made, so the first showing of the "Desert Song" was quite an achievement. Breakdowns had to be dealt with without being able to call in experts, as could be done in a city cinema. Stamping feet from the audience urged the repairers to work fast.

In 1942 Kaylee mechanisms were fitted on the original Bauer frames, and these were in use until the close down.

Last winter the screen came into use again, when it was repaired, and painted for slides to illustrate a lecture organised by the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds.
