Willelme de Rilston many times in witnessing of documents, Wde R. was undertenant, strongly suggested they were united by marriage ties, nothing known of W de R before he witnessed signing of Charters with F.W. (Elias de Rilston married Alice grand daughter of Dolphin of Helton.) Whittaker suggests Rilstons were old Saxon family one of the oldest in Craven - also been suggested W de R was one of lesser Normans who took name of Rilston when he accepted Tenancy under Fauconberg more reasonable. must have had great respect for him to give him tenancy. Rilston held a Manor before 1145

Gave to Fountains Abbey  $\frac{1}{2}$  Car land at Boodley Alan to be received as lay brother, Elias to receive brother's dower in Yetter Rilston (Yetter gill?) True feudal Manor of Wde R surfordm Killens chatels of Lord of Manor, Remained Lords of Manor from before 1145 for many generations they have had v. feudal manor in middle of Township and 2 independent parts of Bucross & Scales two later ~~out lying~~ - never in Paltem of Rilston - Norse could have been Manor of Ravenshills ( $1\frac{1}{2}$  car) possibly remained in free tenancy.

(1) Helton & Rilston had a Single Lord of the Manor who provided a common mill pre. 1295.

1273 gift by Eustace de Rilston to Furness Abbey of free common for Winterton Grange throughout moor and pasture of Helton, Rilston from west and north sides of Helton Beck as far as the bounds of Cracoe.

(2) Helton and Rilston had intercommoning on the Joint Moor.

1st Inclosures bounded in North by Ribston Out Moor, east by Township of Linton West by Bordley Rd, comes to boundary of big Common field high bank. Roads on West Moor, ① Ribston to Helton.

②. Outgang Road ③. An outgang from Ribston. ④ one other Road from Ribston to Helton (Skiresjill Bridge).

⑤ Gangrave road (Cracoe) ⑥ One Road to Bordley (Buckerhouse) (to Fleets Road). ⑦ One Private carriage way or Road for all persons, whatsoever resorting to the Quaker Meeting House -- for Richard Jbbolson to provide gate (Enclosure Award) (Helen.)

Doomsday Survey. King's Thegns, a companion or body guard - Castle and Bridge building - soldiers, holding grant of Manor from King. Norman Conquest. 2 principal Landowners (a) Almunt 4 Car. 1 <sup>car</sup> in Hartlington (b) Ravenchie 1 1/2 Cars, Both King's Thegns; Almunt refused fealty to King and lost land. Ravenchie kept his, Dolphin succeeded Almunt. Dolphin (Helden family) 80 acres. (1 car) suggested cultivated land, probably at death of Dolphin estates came back to King. (Not been proved).

Robert de Romelle 1084-95 King granted him estates of honour of Skipton. In 1166 included one 1/2 car only fee in whole honour of Skipton of 1 1/2 Cars (4 Ribston + 1/2 Scoothrop) Scoothrop eased themselves of it by making a gift to Fountains Etc. Faceington held Estates around Cambridge called on
