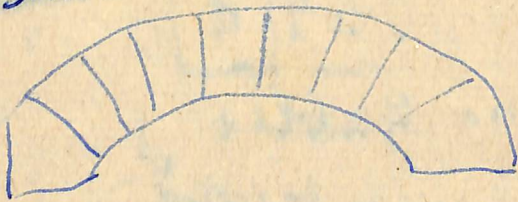

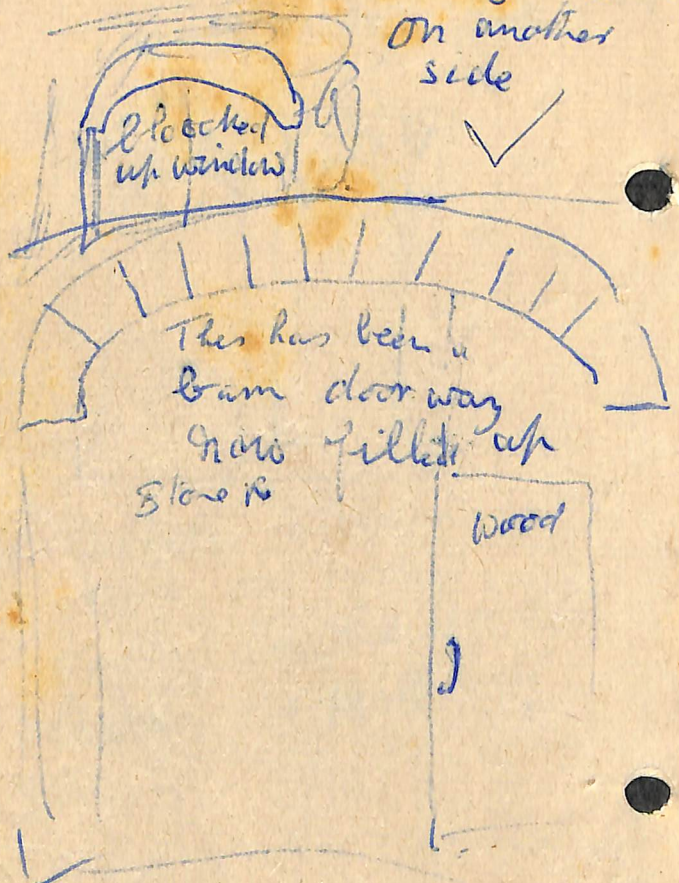

CATHOLICS WANT CHURCH AT GRASSINGTON

Appeal against planning "no"

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Leeds has appealed against the refusal of the West Riding County Council to permit the erection of a Catholic Church, with parking facilities, on land adjoining Grassington Bridge in Upper Wharfedale.

The Ministry of Housing and Local Government is to hold a public inquiry into the appeal which will be conducted at Grassington Town Hall on February 13 by Mr. J. K. Weston, a Ministry Inspector.

Chief objection to the application by the planning authority is that the development of the site in the manner proposed "would create an unwarranted extension of the village group in the direction of the River Wharfe with consequent damage to the visual amenities of the area." The County Council further state that there is land not yet built upon within or "peripheral" to the main village grouping. The development of such land would promote more compact growth.

Father C. Lehane, Parish Priest of St. Stephen's Skipton, and also Rural Dean, declined to comment on the matter when approached by a Craven Herald and Pioneer reporter.
