Farmer's boy became owner of 30 bakery shops in the North

A farmer's son who became head of one of the biggest bakery, restaurant and grocery firms in the North of England, with headquarters at Bradford and branches in most towns of Yorkshire and Lancashire, Mr. John S. Driver, died last week, aged 66, at his home at Upwood, East Morton, near Bingley.

Mr. Driver became an assistant to Edmund Driver, grocer, of Bradford, whose undertaking had grown to 30 shops in Leeds, Bradford and district when Edmund died in 1914.

John S., no relative of Edmund until he married the latter's daughter, purchased the undertaking on the death of his father-in-law and, subsequently adding bakery and confectionery, built up a concern with wide ramifications in the North, an extensive bakery at Plumpton Factory, Bradford, and a headquarters café and Princes Restaurant in Kirkgate, Bradford.

At his home at Upwood, part of the 300 acres estate was given over to the breeding and owning of race-horses, and he had another farm of 90 acres at Tong. One of his horses, Rivoock, named after a prominent moorland edge near Upwood, was second in this year's Lincolnshire Handicap at 50 to 1.

In 1810 The house now known as Craigmoor, was where the Protestants held Prayer Meetings

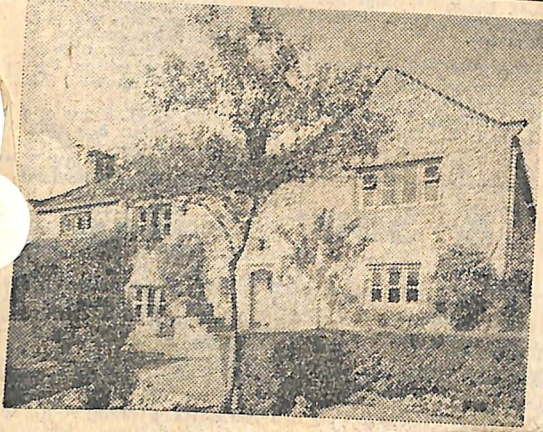


