

YAHS MD 335/6/54/57 Transcribed by M. J. Slater

The document concerns the Manor of Rathmell and is in a very poor state even after repairs and pages are missing. The catalogue description is not adequate since the document also records 39 numbered leases of various dates mixed with a copy of the survey request of June 1685 and the responses in May 1687.

The **18 images** supplied by Special Collections of YAHS documents at Leeds University are out of order with parts in the wrong place so they have been rearranged to make sense. Several folios were numbered bottom left and this order has been kept. The numbers of the 18 images are presumably in the order of folios in the current document and are retained here.

One section repeats the list of 19 articles as a copy of North Yorkshire County Record Office ZXF 3/6/1 to 3/6/5 microfilm frames 51 to 54, for the Survey dated 19th June 1685, but not copied exactly. A partial and small set of responses then follows.

A list of deeds follows. Calculated dates of deeds have been added, bearing in mind that dates for Charles II run from the death of Charles I, not Cromwell. These deeds are additional to those in private hands and part of the Rathmell History Collection in www.dalescommunityarchives.org.uk items RHC/014/001 and /002. Those here dated 1637 probably follow the deed of partition of Rathmell Manor between John Catterall and Samuel Knipe in 1636. None of the deeds are found in the North Yorkshire County Record Office.

The word 'the' is sometimes written instead of 'they'.

Most of the images are of fragmentary folios. [] means paper torn away. (text) means letters inserted where certain. ... means letters or words present but indecipherable. (?) means uncertain reading of letters or words.
